The Civic Education Program offers students a staff guided tour through Council Chambers to see firsthand where and how Council decisions are made.

Students will participate in mock Council debates and apply interactive education tools to identify how to play an active and positive role in the community.

LIBRARIES

Students will take a tour of the Darwin City Library, learn how to navigate through our massive collection and find out about a range of programs and activities on offer outside of school hours.

WASTE AND RECYCLING

Students may only know the Shoal Bay Waste Management Facility as 'The Tip', but there is a lot more going on at Shoal Bay than they realise. Students will learn about:

- Waste minimisation and sustainable waste management
- · How household items are recycled
- Landfill operations, and
- · How we are converting landfill gas into renewable energy!

YOUTH SERVICES

Students will learn about our youth program: 'LAUNCH' that provides a range of opportunities for youth participation in the community, including:

ANIMAL EDUCATION
