## RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. THAT the report entitled 2nd Budget Review 2023/2024 be received and noted.
- 2. THAT Council amend the 2023/2024 budget in accordance with Part 10.5 of the *Local Government Act 2019*, as detailed in report titled 2nd Budget Review 2023/2024 and associated attachments.

## **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this report is to present the 2nd Budget Review 2023/2024 and seek Council's approval of the recommended amendments to the budget.

Budget Reviews provide additional financial information to supplement statutory monthly financial reporting.

## **KEY ISSUES**

- The budget review proposes several amendments to Council's adopted Annual Budget 2023/2024.
- The budget is balanced, as per legislative requirements.

## **DISCUSSION**

The 2nd Budget Review is presented with a decrease in General Funds with the recognition of the Surplus Funds 2022/23 transfer of \$1.06M. There is nil movement in the Net Operating Position as the transfer is a movement from Unrestricted Cash. This is compliant with Section 202 of the Local Government Act 2019, which prohibits budgeting for a deficit except in accordance with the regulations specified in Section 10 of the Local Government (General) Regulations 2021.

This report outlines a high-level summary of some of the significant movements and does not discuss in detail all the variations. The report should be read in conjunction with the detailed notes provided in the attachments for a comprehensive view of all the variations.

## **Overall Impact**

- a. "Net Surplus (Income Statement)", increases leading to an increase in "Funds from operations" (debit) of \$1.02M (Attachments 1 & 2).
- b. "Additional Outflows", net increase of \$8.76M (credit); recognising increase in "Purchases of infrastructure" \$9.12M (Attachment 5).
- c. "Additional Inflows", net increase of \$7.74M (debit); recognising Proceeds from Borrowings of \$6M, Transfers from Reserves increasing by \$0.68M (**Attachment 3**) and a Transfer from Unrestricted Cash of \$1.06M.
- d. The sum of the above (a-c) variations to the existing adopted budget result in a nil effect to the Net Operating Position (**Attachment 2** Bottom Line).

## **Variations of Note**

The overall Net Deficit decreases (improves) by \$0.90M, largely due to the reduction in interest expense \$0.50M and additional income from operating grants \$0.50M. These have been offset by transfer to reserves or to programs as detailed in the attachments.

This review includes a variation to recognise a decrease in income received at the Shoal Bay Waste Management Facility of \$2.5M, offset by a corresponding reduction in operational expenses.

Other variations in the Income Statement include budget adjustments for additional operational grants (offset by expenditure) or transfers from programs as early carry forwards and are provided in the notes of the attachments.

## 2022/2023 Year End Surplus Funds Allocation \$1.06M

In accordance with Resolution ORD800/23 this review recognises \$1.06M available working capital from the prior year and has been allocated as follows:

- \$0.45M allocated to Ward Better Suburbs (\$90k per Ward plus Lord Mayor) and transferred to the Carry Forward Reserve for the 2024/2025 Better Suburbs program
- \$0.41M transferred to Asset Replacement and Refurbishment Reserve
- \$0.20M allocated to Nightcliff Foreshore Café Renovation and transferred to the Carry Forward Reserve to be included in the 2024/2025 capital program

## Purchases of Infrastructure, Property, Plant & Equipment (capital program)

The 2nd Budget Review proposes variations across the capital program and results in a net increase of \$9.12M. Increases greater than \$300k are:

## Waste Management Infrastructure Works + \$6.49M

Stage 2 Expansion Part 1 \$6M – funded by external borrowings.

Ministerial Approval on the external borrowings was received on 3 May 2023 for Part 1 of the 2-part expansion of Stage 2 inert waste cell at Shoal Bay Waste Management Facility. A variation of \$6M is included in the 2nd Budget Review to recognise that the external borrowings will be executed this financial year as works have commenced on the project.

With the delay in the execution of these borrowings, savings in interest and principal repayments have also been recognised in the review. These have been transferred back into the Waste Management Reserve.

- Leachate Pond 3 \$0.33M increase in costs funded by Waste Management Reserve
- Stage <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Cell Capping \$0.16M increase in costs funded by Waste Management Reserve

## Parking Meter Replacement +\$2.30M

A variation to recognise the Parking Meter Replacement project is included in this review, funded by a transfer of \$2M from the Off & On Street Parking Reserve and balance from the CBD Parking Rate Levy Shortfall Reserve. The estimate is as per 10 year parking analysis and may differ once tender is awarded, also noting that dependent on the timing of the contract this may carry forward into the 2024/25 FY.

## Lee Point Rd Upgrade +\$0.67M

Additional funds required to balance the expenditure incurred on the project; funded by \$0.33M transfer from the Developer Contributions Reserve and \$0.34M transfer from capital program Stormwater Drainage projects.

As stated above this is not a full comprehensive list of all the variations, the full detailed list and notes are provided in the attachments to the report.

The term of membership for community members is two (2) years.

## 5.1 Chair

The Lord Mayor is the Chair of the Committee.

The Committee Chair is responsible for:

- Ensuring the good conduct of meetings in accordance with the role and functions of the Committee, and
- ensuring that the Committee's recommendations and actions are in line with the Terms of Reference.

## **PURPOSE**

## Membership

There is no stipulated expectation of gender representation in the current ToR which led to appointment of a committee without any female representation. It is recommended to include an expectation around representation of both genders in the revised ToR.

Another proposed change to the membership, includes one Elected Member from each Ward.

The current ToR didn't contain any information about the roles and responsibilities of the Committee members. An additional section has been included to provide the responsibilities and expectations of the members.

## **Meeting Frequency**

Meeting frequency is currently stipulated as a minimum of four meetings, which is not required. It is recommended to change the frequency to at least two meetings, and no more than four between February and November. The Committee can hold further meetings as required.

## **Governance and Legislative Requirements**

The Governance team has also included governance and legislated requirements for consistency across all Council Committee ToR.

Council approval is sought for the revised ToR at Attachment 2.

## Appointment of Elected Members to Committee

Council appoints members to committees on an annual basis, unless otherwise specified in the ToR.

Elected Members have been requested to nominate for positions on the Committee as outlined in the recommendation.

- Statement of Financial Position (Balance Sheet), which outlines what Council owns (assets) and what it owes (liabilities) at a point in time.
- Notes to the Balance Sheet, this includes further details on the Cash Balance, Trade Debtors, Trade Creditors, and a statement on Council's current payment and reporting obligations.
- Investments, which provides details of treasury activities, investments as at end of month.
- Rates and Receivables Report which provides a summary of outstanding rates and debtors.
- Procurement Reporting, which is a summary of contract variations and exempt procurement.
- Capital Expenditure and Funding, which compares YTD capital expenditure and funding against YTD budget.

Planned Major Projects Capital Works, provides a high-level financial overview of our major projects at a point in time.

### **DISCUSSION**

### February 2024 - Year to Date Result

The year-to-date operating result until 29 February 2024 is a **deficit of (\$7.0M)** compared to a **YTD Budgeted deficit of (\$13.0M)** as highlighted in the table below.

After including capital income, the **Net Surplus is \$1.9M** against the YTD budgeted **deficit of (\$4.4M)**. This has resulted in a favourable **\$6.4M** variance overall (as shown in the income statement).

### Commentary

The Net Operating Position has a favourable variance to the year-to-date revised budget of \$6.04M. The variance results from lower than budgeted materials and contracts, employee costs, and interest expense, offset by lower than anticipated fees and charges. Please find below additional commentary for the material variances:

### Income

Total Operating Income is tracking below budget by \$3.0M.

### User Fees & Charges

The unfavourable variance is \$5.1M. This is mainly due to Waste Fees & Charges being under YTD expectations as the volume of material received through Shoal Bay is lower than anticipated. This reduction in revenue is partially offset by a decrease in waste related expenditure.

### <u>Interest / Investment Income</u>

The favourable variance mainly relates to the increase in returns received on investments due to the high Reserve Bank of Australia (RBA) cash rate.

### **Expenditure**

Total Expenses are under budget by \$9.1M. This is due to underspends in Materials & Contracts \$6.5M, and Employee Expenses of \$2.2M.

### Materials & Contracts

Materials and Contracts expenses has an annual budget of \$63.9M and this incorporates various expenditure types. Combined, this budget line is under budget with a variance of \$6.5M. This largely relates to expenses associated with waste management at Shoal Bay Waste Management Facility (SBWMF), which is offset by a reduction in revenue. The favourable variance is currently forecast to become a realised favourable variance and the budget will be adjusted at the 2<sup>nd</sup> Budget Review.

Other variances mainly relate to timing of programs. A timing variance relates to a budgeted revenue or expense that has not occurred at the time it was expected, but which is still expected to occur within the budget year. That is, the financial transaction will still occur - but just in a different month. With the timing variances there should be no impact on the projected budget.

### **Employee Expenses**

Employee costs report a positive variance to budget of \$2.2M. This variance is offset in part by increases in contract and other labour sources and the variance will further reduce when leave provisioning is adjusted at year end.

### **Depreciation and Amortisation**

Depreciation is over budget by \$1.2M, this is a non-cash expense and will be considered at a future budget review.

### **Interest Expenses**

Interest expenses show a positive variance (\$1.4M) due to loan offsets been utilised against the variable loans and timing of the draw down for loan SBWMF Stage 2 Expansion, Phase 1.

### Statement of Fund Flows

The variances are related to a mismatch in the timing of projects and budget profiles, and the reasons described above under operating statement commentary. Purchase of Infrastructure, Property, Plant & Equipment variance relates to timing of capital projects.

### Cash and Investments Note A

City of Darwin has achieved 4.92% on weighted average interest rate on its February 2024 cash and investment portfolio of \$88.8M (excluding loan offset \$37.5M). There have been no investment policy breaches in this month.

The Investment Reports include surplus cash funds that are placed against variable loans. These funds are considered 'at call' as they can be accessed in short time frames.

### **Treasury Comment**

The RBA met on 6 February 2024 and the board decided to leave the cash rate unchanged at 4.35%. The RBA commented "while recent data indicate that inflation is easing, it remains high. The Board expects that it will be some time yet before inflation is sustainably in the target range. The path of interest rates that will best ensure that inflation returns to target in a reasonable timeframe will depend upon the data and the evolving assessment of risks, and a further increase in interest rates cannot be ruled out. The Board will continue to pay close attention to developments in the global economy, trends in domestic demand, and the outlook for inflation and the labour market."

### Accounts Receivable (Trade Debtors) Note B

This section considers the receipt timing of Rates collection and any general Debtors outstanding. The report also includes information on aged debtors including general debtors, infringements, and Rates arrears.

### Accounts Payable (Trade Creditors) Note C

Accounts Payable owing at 29 February 2024 was \$10.5M at the time of reporting. City of Darwin recognises the liability of invoices once goods are receipted as received.

### Other notes to the financial reports

The Council has met its payment and reporting obligations for GST, Fringe Benefits Tax, PAYG withholding tax, superannuation, and insurance for the month.

Our internal accounting conventions for monthly reporting currently recognise the Council Rates that are attributable to that month and then progressively throughout the year.

Please note that these reports are unaudited management financial reports. Information contained in the reports was current as at the date of the reports and may not reflect any event or circumstances which occurred after the date the reports were completed.



#### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

THAT the report entitled Elected Member Allowances 2024/2025 be received and noted.

#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this report is to present the Elected Member Allowances for 2024/2025.

#### **KEY ISSUES**

- Elected Member Allowances are set in accordance with the Local Government Act 2019.
- The Remuneration Tribunal Report and Determination No. 1 of 2024 Allowances for Members of Local Government Councils was made on 29 January 2024 and tabled in the Northern Territory Legislative Assembly on 14 February 2024.
- The Determination is considered made on the date it was signed by the Tribunal, which was 29 January 2024.
- Policy and guidance documents will be updated accordingly and prior to July 2024.
- The Tribunal's Determination is final and requires no further approval.

#### **DISCUSSION**

Council must set Elected Member allowances for each financial year when it adopts its annual budget. On 6 April 2023, the Administrator of the Northern Territory, issued a request to the Remuneration Tribunal to determine the allowance.

The Determination is considered made on the date it was signed by the Tribunal, which was 29 January 2024. This means that the Determination comes into effect on 1 July 2024. The Determination of allowances for members of local councils is at **Attachment 1**.

The table below outlines the 2024/25 maximum allowances that can apply to City of Darwin Elected Members.

#### **Councillor Allowance**

The Councillor Allowance covers those activities required of a Council Member in the performance of his or her role as an elected representative.

The Councillor Allowance is to cover:

- any cost to Councillors for attending meetings and activities of Council where these costs are not reimbursed by Council
- contribution towards phone and internet usage
- contribution towards any home and office supplies
- allowance towards costs incurred in servicing constituents in Ward or Council Area, including, but not limited to:
  - o donations
  - o organisation sponsorship
  - o membership fees
  - o patron expenses
  - constituent support

#### **Professional Development Allowance**

An allowance payable to Council Members to attend appropriate and relevant conferences or training courses which sustain a member's professional competence by keeping the member informed of, and able to comply with, development in professional standards applicable to their role as a Council Member. Any such course/conference must have approval and be in line with Council policy to attract this allowance.

The Professional Development Allowance is \$4,000.00 in a financial year and will now be more flexible. The total of two years' worth of allocations can be used in one financial year, as long as the Councillor would still be within their elected term.

#### **Extra Meeting Allowance**

Elected Members may claim an extra meeting allowance for various meetings including:

- Special Council Meetings and Workshops
- City of Darwin Executive and Advisory Committees
- Outside Committees with Local Government Association of the Northern Territory appointed representation
- Outside Committees with City of Darwin appointed representation
- Councillor Briefings
- Workshops hosted by City of Darwin
- Attendance at professional development courses/conferences that are approved and in addition to the Professional Development Allowance

Members must have attended at least 75% of the duration of a meeting to claim an extra meeting allowance and up to a maximum of two extra meetings per day may be claimed not exceeding the maximum payable for any one day.

The Extra Meeting Allowance must not be paid for Ordinary Council Meetings as they are covered in the base allowance.

The Extra Meeting Allowance may be accessed by all Councillors and Deputy Principal Members.

The Extra Meeting Allowance is paid per meeting but is capped for each financial year at \$10,000.00. The amount payable is determined by the length of the meeting.

# DETERMINATION OF ALLOWANCES FOR MEMBERS OF LOCAL COUNCILS

#### **REPORT ON DETERMINATION NO. 1 OF 2024**

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

On 6 April 2023, pursuant to section 7B(1) of the Assembly Members and Statutory Officers (Remuneration and Other Entitlements) Act 2006 (AMSORE Act), His Honour Professor the Honourable Hugh Heggie PSM, Administrator of the Northern Territory, issued a request to the Remuneration Tribunal (the Tribunal) to inquire into and determine the allowance or allowances payable to a member of a local council.

The resulting Report and Determination must be tabled in the Legislative Assembly within six sitting days of receipt by the Minister.

Under section 7B(7) of the AMSORE Act, the allowances determined are effective from either:

- the next financial year if the report is made on or before 1 February; or
- from the financial year after the next financial year if the report is made after 1 February.

On 18 August 2023, individual letters were sent to each Council inviting submissions and offered to hold a discussion with each Council either in person or through a video link. On 26 August 2023, an advertisement was placed in the NT News to announce the inquiry and invite submissions.

Further correspondence invited Councils to arrange to meet with the Tribunal and 8 meetings were held with Councils and one with Local Government Association of the Northern Territory (LGANT).

The Tribunal received ten submissions from the following Councils as well as LGANT:

- City of Palmerston Council
- Alice Spring Town Council
- MacDonnell Regional Council
- Central Desert Regional Council
- Roper Gulf Regional Council
- East Arnhem Regional Council
- West Arnhem Regional Council
- Victoria Daly Regional Council
- Wagait Shire Council

#### 2. VEHICLE ALLOWANCE FOR THE USE OF PRIVATE VEHICLES

Following the introduction of the vehicle allowances capped at \$5000 per year, the Tribunal received representations from a number of Councils indicating that the cap did not cover the real cost of travel to Council Meetings. The Tribunal accepts that allowances must be fair and equitable, and Councillors should not be out of pocket when attending meetings and activities approved by Council. However, the Tribunal has been hampered by the lack of detail of cost provided from most Regional Councils.

The Tribunal has increased the cap to \$10 000 a year, but Councils need to take into account the cap and ensure that policies and procedures are in place to avoid unnecessary meetings involving travel.

In addition to the lifting of the cap, the Tribunal has made two other changes in the Determination to assist Regional Councillor's travel costs.

Firstly, the Tribunal recognises that many Councillors are required to attend local government authority meetings in their ward. The Tribunal has determined that vehicle allowances paid to attend local authority meetings in their ward will not be included in the cap.

Secondly, the Tribunal determined travel time to and from Council Meetings should be paid and this is addressed in Clause 3 below.

#### 3. TRAVEL TIME

ORIGINAL PAPER

The Tribunal is aware that some regional councillors travel long distances to attend Council Meetings and this travel time is not remunerated. Additionally, some councillors need to take time off work for this travel time. While the councillors are paid an annual allowance, it is not intended to cover loss of wages.

Accordingly, the Tribunal has recognised this situation and has extended the payment of extra activity allowance to cover travel time while travelling to Council Meetings and local authority meetings in the new Determination.

#### 4. PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT ALLOWANCE

The Tribunal noted that the Professional Development Allowance included in the 2023 Determination has been interpreted by many councils to limit payment to cover the registration or attendance fee only of the particular professional development activity. This has resulted in some councillors being out of pocket for associated costs including travel and travel time.

The Tribunal sees the Professional Development Allowance regard as an all-inclusive allowance covering associated costs up to \$4000 a year.

The Tribunal has also raised the Professional Development Allowance for Councillors in Shire Councils to \$4000 each year.

#### 5. COUNCILLOR'S ALLOWANCE

The Tribunal has made two changes to the base councillor's allowance. Firstly, it has reviewed the factors that it considers when establishing the various levels of the base allowance. The Tribunal has added total assets and annual financials to these factors. Consequently, the Tribunal has created an additional level within the base so that Palmerston City Council should sit just above Alice Springs and Litchfield Councils but below Darwin Council.

The Tribunal has also increased the basic allowances paid to every Councillor by 2.5% in recognition of general wage and salary increases across the Territory over the past year.

#### 6. EXTRA MEETING / ACTIVITY ALLOWANCE

The Tribunal has made minor changes in the Determination to ensure that the activity allowance is accessed when attending an approved function of Council.

The Tribunal has kept the Allowance at a maximum of \$10 000 following the lack of any evidence showing that this maximum is inadequate for any particular Councillor.

#### 7. RESETTLEMENT ALLOWANCE

The Tribunal received representation from a number of Councils regarding a resettlement allowance for Mayors when they leave office.

The submissions indicated that the mayoral role was the single source of income for many mayors, therefore financial hardship was a possible outcome when the mayor departs the role.

Similar representation was made in relation to councillors including those that have been suspended without notice.

These issues may be considered in any future Remuneration Tribunal's Inquiry.

#### 8. SUPERANNUATION

A number councils raised the issue of superannuation; however, the AMSORE Act specifically excludes the Remuneration Tribunal's consideration.

#### 9. FUTURE INQUIRIES

This is the second inquiry into Members of Local Government Council Allowances by the Tribunal and it has been useful for the Tribunal to address some factors that were outstanding from 2022 Inquiry.

The Tribunal believes that there are still some outstanding issues that need addressing and these would be enhanced with face-to-face meetings with some Councils outside of Darwin. An Inquiry in 2025 will also allow Councils and Councillors to raise any issues that have resulted from the first two Determinations.

The Tribunal would appreciate feedback from Councils as to the adequacy of allowances mentioned in the Determination.

#### **DETERMINATION NO. 1 OF 2024**

Under section 7B of the Assembly Members and Statutory Officers (Remuneration and Other Entitlements) Act 2006, the Tribunal determines as follows:

#### 1. **DEFINITIONS**

#### Municipal Councils are the following:

- Alice Springs;
- · Darwin;
- Katherine;
- · Litchfield; and
- Palmerston.

#### Regional Councils are the following:

- Barkly;
- Central Desert;
- East Arnhem;
- MacDonnell;
- Roper Gulf;
- Tiwi Islands
- West Arnhem;
- West Daly; and
- Victoria Daly.

#### Shire Councils are the following:

- Belyuen;
- · Coomalie; and
- Wagait.

**New Councils**: any other Councils newly constituted by the Minister for Local Government in 2024.

Financial Year is the period from 1 July to the 30 June.

5 Report and Determination No. 1 of 2024 – Allowances for Members of Local Government Councils

Councils are defined in the *Local Government Act 2019* as an area, and means the Local Council constituted for that area under section 14(b).

The role of Mayor is defined in section 58 of the Local Government Act 2019 and is prescribed as:

- (1) The Principal Member of a municipal council is to have the title Mayor.
- (2) However:
  - (a) in the case of the council for the City of Darwin local government area the principal member is to have the title Lord Mayor; and
  - (b) in the case of the Litchfield Council the council may, by resolution, decide the principal member instead has the title President.
- (3) The Council may, by resolution, decide the principal member of a regional or shire council has the title Mayor or President.

Deputy Mayor is defined in the Local Government Act 2019.

Councillor is a member of a Local Council:

#### 2. ALLOWANCES

The following annual allowances will apply from 1 July 2024 and will be paid fortnightly or monthly:

#### 3. INCLUSIONS OF ALL ALLOWANCES

The Allowances are to cover:

- any cost to Councillors of attending meetings and activities of Council where these costs are not reimbursed by Council;
- contribution towards phone and internet usage;
- contribution towards any home office and supplies; and
- allowance towards costs incurred in servicing constituents in Ward or Council Area:
  - Including, but not limited to:
    - donations;
    - organization sponsorship;
    - membership fees;
    - patron expenses; and
    - constituent support.

#### 4. EXTRA MEETING / ACTIVITY ALLOWANCE

- 4.1. An Extra Meeting / Activity Allowance of up to \$10,000 per financial year, may be accessed by all Councillors and Deputy Principal Members. The allowance may be accessed as follows:
  - special meetings of full Council or established committees of Council;
  - attendance at Local Authority Meetings within the Ward the member represents;
  - attendance at any functions representing the Principal Member on official Council duties;
  - attendance at functions/meetings as an invited representative of Council and with Council's approval; and
  - attendance at any approved extra meetings of Council for planning, briefing or information sessions of council meetings.

The activity allowance may be paid as travel time when travelling to Council meetings and meetings of Local Authorities within the ward the Councillor represents, where the travel involves at least 50kms from home base (at least 100kms return). This activity Allowance is not to be included in the cap of \$10 000.

- 4.2. Allowances to be paid to eligible members (not including Principal Members) are:
  - Fee for attendance at extra meetings or activities is the accumulated hours on any one day and are as follow:

o up to 2 hours

\$200

o between 2 and 4 hours

\$300

o more than 4 hours

\$500 (maximum payable for any one day)

#### 5. PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT ALLOWANCE

5.1. Professional Development Allowance is \$4000 per person, per financial year and will be paid to all Principal Members, Deputy Principal Members and Councillors.

- 5.2. The Professional Development Allowance is an inclusive allowance which covers costs associated with the Professional Development activities including registration and attendance fees, travel cost including vehicle allowance, travel allowances and travel time as specified in clause 4.2.
- 5.3. Any course or professional development activity must be specifically related to the role of the Councillor and be approved by the Council. The Australian Institute of Company Directors' Courses should be encouraged, as well as professional development activity that is arranged by the Local Government Association of Northern Territory.
- 5.4. Total amount claimable each year is the total of two years, being based on an annual allowance, plus one year drawn in advance or one year's remaining balance from a previous year. The maximum amount claimable by any Councillor is the total sum of one year for each year of the Councillor's elected term.
- 5.5. Proof of completion for each stage of the course is required before further payments can be claimed.

#### 6. VEHICLE ALLOWANCE

- 6.1. Vehicle Allowance will be available for travel undertaken by all Councillors when the travel:
  - (a) exceeds 50kms from home base 100kms return,
  - (b) travel does not occur in a Council supplied and maintained vehicle;
  - (c) the Councillor is not in receipt of a motor vehicle allowance in Clause 7 below; and
  - (d) the vehicle allowance is capped at \$10,000.
- 6.2. Vehicle Allowance will be in the form of kilometre allowance which will be paid at rates set by the Australian Taxation Office each year and is 85 cents a kilometre in 2023-24.
- 6.3. Vehicle Allowance will be available in the following circumstances:
  - travel to and from statutory Council meetings;
  - travel to and from official Council approved meeting;
  - travel to and from approved functions representing the Principal Member;
  - travel to and from Local Authority Meetings within the ward the Councillor represents.
  - travel to and from all meetings of Council and their committees; and
  - travel to and from any additional activity where Extra Meeting/Activity Allowance has been approved.
- 6.4. When a kilometre reimbursement is paid, travel time will also be paid utilising extra meetings/activities rate. This payment is not to be included in the extra meetings/activities cap as specified in Clause 4.1.
- 6.5. The Vehicle Allowance Cap will not include:
  - travel to and from Local Authorities Meetings within the Ward that the member represents;
  - travel involved with Professional Development activities;

#### 7. PROVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLE

- 7.1. Principal Members of Municipal and Regional Councils are entitled to a Council maintained vehicle.
- 7.2. If Principal Members of Municipal and Regional Councils choose not to be provided with a Council maintained vehicle, they are entitled to Motor Vehicle Allowance, paid fortnightly or monthly, and will be:
  - \$25,000 per year for Municipal Principal Members; or
  - \$40,000 per year for Regional Principal Members.
- 7.3 The Principal members of the Shire Councils may claim reimbursement in accordance with Clause 6.1.

#### 8. TRAVEL ALLOWANCE

- 8.1 Principal Members, Deputy Principal Members and Councillors who are required to stay away from home overnight on approved Council business, will be entitled to Travel Allowance.
- The applicable rates to be paid are found in Table 1 of Taxation Determination TD 2023/3 or any subsequent Taxation Determination made in substitution of that Determination.

#### 9. GENERAL

- 9.1. Pursuant to section 7B(7) of the Assembly Members and Statutory Officers (Remuneration and Other Entitlements) Act 2006, the allowances determined are effective from either:
  - the next financial year if the report is made on or before 1 February; or

- The sentiment from survey responses was supportive of the Nightcliff Oval Changeroom Proposal with 90.4 per cent of respondents in support of AFL NT's proposal to construct new changeroom facilities, 4.1 per cent opposed and 5.5 per cent "other" providing a detailed response.

#### DISCUSSION

With endorsement from Council, City of Darwin officers conducted a stakeholder and community engagement process from 22 January to 5 February 2024.

Using the International Association for Public Participation principles that guide good community engagement, the engagement was conducted at the levels of inform and consult.

The goal of this engagement process was to ensure that the Nightcliff Oval Changeroom proposal was undertaken with strong input from key stakeholders and the broader community.

#### **Engagement objectives**

- Inform the community and key stakeholders about AFL NT's proposal to build a fit-forpurpose, four-room change room complex.
- Seek feedback on the proposed fit-for-purpose, four-room change room complex.
- Explore the current usage, preferences, and local knowledge of the Nightcliff Oval facilities.

#### **Communications and engagement tactics**

City of Darwin used communications and engagement tactics such as to raise awareness of the proposal and associated engagement process:

#### **Engagement reach snapshot**


The snapshot of the reach of the engagement process is provided below:

- 552 people aware through Engage Darwin website.
- 379 people informed through Engage Darwin website.
- 218 survey submissions through Engage Darwin website.
- 22,108 people reached on social media (via official City of Darwin accounts).

#### **Consultation outcomes**

Some 218 survey submissions were made during the 15-day consultation.

The sentiment from survey responses was positive for the Nightcliff Oval Changerooms Proposal:



Key feedback in support of the Nightcliff Oval Changeroom Proposal centred around the need for updated modern facilities; appropriate changeroom/bathroom facilities for non-male players; amenities that were larger to accommodate multiple teams at once and improving community cohesion.

Opposers raised concerns about the amount of money being spent stating it was too high and held the belief that money should be spent on facilities that are more deteriorated. There were conflicting views and understanding about gender neutral facilities for female and gender diverse community members.

## **Executive summary**

#### **Background**

Nightcliff Oval is considered a District level oval under City of Darwin's Sports Field Plan 2016-2026. It caters for AFL and cricket and includes one of only four turf cricket wickets at City of Darwin ovals. The venue is the home ground for Nightcliff Football Club and Nightcliff Cricket Club. Traditionally clubs have used a combination of the existing change rooms and neighbouring Nightcliff Sports Club changerooms. However, Nightcliff Sports Club have shared plans to redevelop their facilities which will remove their current change rooms. Both clubs have experienced a growth in membership and advised that the remaining change rooms will not be sufficient to accommodate current player numbers once the Nightcliff Oval Sportclub redevelops their facilities.

In February 2022, Council provided in-principle support for the stakeholders revised Nightcliff Oval Masterplan. A key project in the masterplan and an immediate priority for AFL NT and the Nightcliff Football Club is the proposed new fit-for-purpose, four-room change room complex, aimed at providing a safe, inclusive environment for oval users.

Approval for any upgrades proposed in the revised Nightcliff Oval Masterplan are subject to:

- (a) Funding confirmation.
- (b) City of Darwin's community engagement process.
- (c) Detailed design and technical specifications, including accessibility requirements, being to the satisfaction of City of Darwin.
- (d) Financial planning for ongoing maintenance and renewal.

With endorsement from Council (RESOLUTION ORDER ORD712/23) City of Darwin conducted an engagement process which commenced on 22 January 2024 and ended on 5 February 2024.

#### **Engagement**

Some 218 survey submissions were made during the 15-day engagement period. Using the International Association for Public Participation (IAP2) spectrum of engagement, engagement was conducted at the levels of inform and consult. City of Darwin used tactics such as a survey on the Engage Darwin website, letter/emails to stakeholders and residents, social media content, proactive and reactive media relations, and internal communications.

The sentiment from survey responses was positive for the Nightcliff Oval Changeroom Proposal with 90.4 per cent of respondents supporting AFL NT's proposal to construct new changeroom facilities at







## Feedback analysis

The sentiment from survey responses was supportive of the Nightcliff Oval Changeroom Proposal with 90.4 per cent of respondents in support of AFL NT's proposal to construct new changeroom facilities, 4.1 per cent opposed and 5.5 per cent "other" providing a detailed response.

Key feedback in support centred around:

- Inclusivity. Safe, appropriate facilities contribute to a more inclusive environment notably for women and gender diverse players.
- Social/community cohesion. New, larger facilities would support the local sporting community and in turn strengthen the Nightcliff community.
- Industry development. New facilities would support the advancement of two important community clubs (cricket and AFL), increase women's participation and attract interstate players.
- More space. Bigger, multi-room facilities would adequately accommodate the large number of players, officials and volunteers who use the oval.

Opposers raised concerns about:

- Financial impact of building the changerooms. Respondents believed the amount of money proposed for the works was too high and that the existing changeroom block is still serviceable.
- Funds being used on other facilities including a grandstand, lights, pavilion, shade to provide shelter for players.

There were conflicting views about the following topics:

• Gender neutral bathrooms. There seemed to be misunderstanding about the purpose of the gender-neutral facilities, which referred to any of the change rooms being suitable to be used for either a women's or men's team. Many respondents acknowledged the current issues of lack of privacy in the current facilities, however there were mixed responses about whether the bathrooms should be gender neutral or gender specific bathrooms. Some believed gender neutral facilities were essential for Nightcliff's queer community, to respond to the needs of all and to increase female participation. Others felt separate bathrooms should be required for women, girls and baby changing facilities to keep women safe.

Having non-gendered bathrooms will help trans people feel safe to change and use whatever bathroom rather than having to try to use one kind of bathroom and possibly be harrassed. As a nonbinary female bodied person who dresses masculine and who has done some testosterone giving me some masculine features such as a lower voice, I feel unsafe walking into a male bathroom because I have obvious breasts and I am afraid of sexual harassment, but I get questioned when I walk into the female bathroom until they notice my breasts. Gender neutral bathrooms would help me feel a lot safer as it wouldn't matter which bathroom I am using, it would be the right one. Gender neutral bathrooms also assist parents of children, as I am a parent who often has to take my son into the bathroom with me. As he is getting older, I am afraid of letting him go into the "men's bathroom" alone without supervision, for his own safety but also to ensure he behaves appropriately, yet as he ages he is less welcome in the women's bathroom and would be expected to use the men's bathroom independently. I can imagine it's even harder for dads caring for young girls, feeling like taking their daughter into the men's bathroom is unsafe if there are other men there, but feeling that walking into the women's bathroom with their daughter is invading women's spaces. If there are sufficient private stalls in a gender neutral bathroom, this eliminates the feelings of unsafety particularly for parents of young children, it makes supervision of children using the bathroom a lot easier.

It also fails to meet the AFL Minimum Facility Guidelines for size of change rooms, toilet numbers and ability to have separate and equal changerooms for men and women. The shared facilities between the two change rooms does not allow for all the change rooms to be used separately and therefore does not meet what the project sets out to achieve by providing 4 changerooms. The number of toilets currently barely allows enough for a single team to utilise them (one of the rooms has a single AMB WC to share for the whole team!?). This looks like it was designed in the 90s before any standards were put in place and will not provide improvement on the current brick changerooms already there. The proposed design also does not replace the seats that will be removed, even though there is a planned stage 2 there will be an immediate impact to reduce visibility of the ground and not provide any additional seating.

### Question

When is the City of Darwin going to debate the merits of the Declaration of the Heritage Listing of the Darwin Esplanade? The Minister, Chanston James Paech, Minister for Heritage made a provisional declaration of Heritage Place, The Esplanade on 24 April 2023.

#### Response

City of Darwin is aware of the provisional heritage listing of The Esplanade in 2023. City of Darwin is of the view that this listing was not in accordance with the requirements of the Heritage Act 2011 (NT).

Therefore, Council approved City of Darwin taking legal action against this heritage listing to ensure an appropriate outcome is achieved. This matter was heard in the Supreme Court in November 2023.

It is not appropriate for City of Darwin to comment further while this matter is being considered and awaiting judgement.

#### Question 1

Who authorised the change of the Commemorative event for the bombing of Darwin from the dedicated site at the Esplanade to the Convention Centre?

#### Response

The change of venue was authorised and endorsed by City of Darwin's Chief Executive Officer, and City of Darwin's Lord Mayor.

It is never easy to change the location of an event, however our main priority was and will always be the safety of our community.

The ground at the Cenotaph was extremely waterlogged in the lead up to the event, meaning it was unsafe for our suppliers to access the site to set up and bump into the event. Coupled with predicted forecast rain, as well as the possibility of Cyclone Lincoln, which was upgraded from a 'watch' to a 'warning', meant that the ground would have become even wetter and muddier, causing further community safety concerns as well the potential for extensive damage to the cenotaph area and surrounds.

This would have also affected attendees on the day, as the surface would have been very unsafe and with limited access for all members of the community.

We decided as early as possible to ensure the public were notified well in advance of the event, and could change their event plans accordingly, as well as ensuing partners and suppliers had enough time to prepare.

# Question 2

Who advised that the weather would be unsuitable to hold the event at the Esplanade?

#### Response

City of Darwin was provided advice from the Bureau of Meteorology that there was more rain forecast, in addition to the flooding that had already taken place earlier in the week.

#### Question 3

What were the costs of erecting and dismantling the shade structures which have previously proved effective protection against rain for the event?

# Response

There were no additional costs associated with this, as the relevant costs were already factored into the event budget.

#### **Question 4**

Why was the extensive area adjacent to the Cenotaph fenced off on the 19 February this year?

#### Response

Fencing is installed each year as this section of Bicentennial Park is considered a worksite, therefore appropriate WHS measures are required to successfully obtain an event permit to host the event.

Had we have not changed the venue, the fencing would have been removed on Saturday 18 February and re-installed post event once the event had concluded and bump out began.

#### Question 5

This year it was moved at short notice notwithstanding a lack of supporting advice from the Bureau of Meteorology, which merely noted a chance of rain.

#### Response

The event was moved five days out from the event, which we are confident is enough time to accurately notify people who were intending on attending the event.

The City of Darwin staff also communicated with a BOM representative around forecasts.

The Bureau of Meteorology was consistently predicting rain, which would have made the ground wetter and muddier, affecting suppliers in the lead up to the event as well as attendees on the day.

We were just as disappointed as you to see that no rain eventuated, however given the facts at the time of making the decision, the right decision was made. The timing was necessary to be able to secure an alternative venue and ensure appropriate setup.

#### **Question 6**

The diminishing of this important event, replacing the Cenotaph with a pile of sandbags with a rifle sticking out of it is offensive to me and I suspect others. I am not sure about the protocol of saluting the pile of sandbags, or perhaps the homage was intended for the flowers adorning it.

#### Response

The idea of the makeshift Cenotaph was from the Australian Defence Force (ADF), and they facilitated its construction.
