

Expression of Interest (EOI)

Seeking Larrakia Cultural Content for East Point Signage Update

26 November 2025

City of Darwin is seeking Expressions of Interest from Larrakia people or organisations interested in providing cultural content to update the 'Science Trail' signage at East Point Reserve.

Objective: As part of this project, we aim to introduce three new public signs based on Larrakia cultural knowledge, values and stories connected to East Point Reserve, such as significant local animals, plants, bush tucker, and connection to this land.

Selection criteria: City of Darwin is seeking Larrakia contributors who can recommend and provide written content for these three new public signs. The successful applicant will be engaged on an hourly basis to:

- Draft, edit, review and approve content for the three new signs
- Provide input on visual design
- Optional Create design elements and artwork

We encourage applications from Larrakia Traditional Owners and local Larrakia community members with expertise of Larrakia culture and stories to share.

Applications should include your contact details, schedule of rates and relevant prior experience/works. If you could please let us know before Friday 5th December if you intend to submit an application, this would be much appreciated.
