City of Darwin has managed East Point Reserve since 1984.

Current management of the 200 hectare site aims to balance the ecological, cultural and historic values whilst providing recreational areas for everyone to enjoy.

Over 30 hectares of East Point Reserve remains native vegetation.

Management of this is guided by the East Point Reserve Biodiversity 5 Year Management Plan 2014 - 2018.
