The Lord Mayor reported on his attendance at the annual Gold Plate Awards. It was one of the best in years and the hospitality talent we have in our city is outstanding. New categories were added this year including a 'barista' award. Industry has a preference for local produce and promoting local produce.

Councillor Klonaris reported on FFNT offered Malak residents a community Q&A session. Proceeded with the Olympic club representatives and a huge number of residents attended. Culminated in Darwin Olympic agreeing to go back to FFNT to Agreement for Olympic to FFNT to do a cost analysis/feasibility of alternate locations. Ngaree Ah Kit, Member for Karama attended and offered support for funding to cover the cost of that work to identify an alternative location.

Councillor Arnold reported on community event at Tamarind Park to discuss anti-social behaviour. Police Commissioner was in attendance. Urging people to ring and report as the data about hotspots is important. Also met with Michael Rotumah, CEO of Larrakia Nation. He will be looking into duplication of services and cross-overs in rostering of similar services so they can be spread to achieve better coverage.

Councillor O'Gallagher reported on various meetings in the Phillipines; upcoming visits they have planned for Darwin; a study/loan scheme they have underway; and an interest in establishing a Friendship City relationship.

The Lord Mayor reported on a meeting with the Chief Minister following his letter relating to antisocial behaviour issues. The meeting produced good results including a change of policy regarding police graduates previously being sent to remote locations, however they will now remain in Darwin. Options are currently being worked on to enable prisoners to be able to provide clean up services in parks. A similar arrangement is already occurring in Alice Springs.

The General Manager Matt Grassmayr responded and advised that it was closed and under assessment. An Environmental Impact Plan is being developed by consultants to enable a works permit to be issued. A structural engineer is investigating options to either repair or replace the bridge and a temporary crossing may be able to be put in place while the works proceed. We will know more in about three weeks on the various options. It will be a large scale capital project, and potentially take 10 months to complete.
