Visual stories are used to prepare a person for and increase the predictability of a new environment or situation. This helps bring familiarity to a process and to reduce anxiety and stress.


This guide provides information on how to access the **Halloween Haunted House Disco**, what to expect when you arrive and who to ask for assistance.

The event will be held on


Day: Friday 31 October 2025

Getting there


Malak Community Centre is located at 13 Malak Cres Malak, next to Malak Primary School.

I can enter the event through the Spooky Maze

OR

Through the general entry (quieter entry)

Creepy Spooky Maze entry

This year, there will be entry to the event through an outdoor Creepy Spooky Maze.

This will include:

- Halloween decorations that may include gore and horror imagery
- Loud noises
- Staff jumping out to scare people

You do not have to enter through the maze. You may use the alternative general entry, as shown on the map.


Additional Accessibility features

A Quiet Space

- Located close to the carpark
- Wheelchair accessible
- Acts as an alternative entry point to the event
- Airconditioned
- Has sensory items available.

Accessible Parking

Located in the carpark.



Things to consider

The event will be:

- Hot (but with airconditioned indoor options)
- Noisy, with loud music and games
- Crowded
- Halloween themed decorations and costumes may be include gore and horror imagery, such as severed body parts.

Who will I see, and who can help me?

City of Darwin staff will be able to assist me if I need help.



They will wear a navy blue shirt with a City of Darwin logo




They may also be dressed up in Halloween costumes

Toilets

I can find accessible toilets inside the venue, between the disco and the quiet zone.

The staff wearing City of Darwin uniforms can help me find the toilets if I need help.

I can use the toilet any time during the disco.



What to expect during the event

There will be lots of options for different activities including sensory play, stories, games, dancing and food.

There will be Halloween decorations that might be spooky, creepy or gruesome.

The event runs for around 3 hours. I can come at any time and leave at any time.

There will be loud noises and loud music in some areas, but also quiet spaces to go if I need a break.



End of the event

When the event is finished, the lights and music will change.

People will then start to go home.

I can leave whichever way is most convenient, and there will be staff to help guide the way.
