DISCUSSION

mirragma gunugurr-wa

Bicentennial Park is now home to mirragma gunugurr-wa (bamboo raft), the City of Darwin's most significant investment in Larrakia art to date. mirragma gunugurr-wa refers to the bamboo raft the Larrakia used to cross the ocean from Cox Peninsula to Darwin.

Consisting of a 4m steel mermaid tail and a bamboo raft, mirragma gunugurr-wa tells a Mermaid story, complete with tidal markings and Larrakia language inscribed on the base of the work.

A QR code at the base of the work gives access to two short films where Larrakia artists Uncle Roque and Trent Lee share the story and language behind mirragma gunugurr-wa.

mirragma gunugurr-wa was officially launched by the Lord Mayor of Darwin the Honourable Kon Vatskalis on Monday 31 July, and was attended by His Honour Professor The Honourable Hugh Heggie, Administrator of the Northern Territory, Elected Members and staff, stakeholders and the general public.

Aunty Bilawara Lee welcomed everyone to country, while Trent Lee performed a smoking ceremony for those in attendance, and over the artwork.

Local media outlets attended the launch, which was also documented by local photographer Charlie Bliss. The launch was featured on ABC Radio Darwin's mornings program, ABC News, Channel 9 News, along with an article in the NT News.

Larrakia artists Uncle Roque and Trent Lee developed the concept for mirragma gunugurr-wa, with public art consultants GARUWA Creative helping to bring it to life.

mirragma gunugurr-wa was funded by City of Darwin in collaboration with Larrakia Nation Aboriginal Corporation and GARUWA Creative. Additional support for the digital assets was provided by Northern Territory Department of Industry, Tourism and Trade, and Regional Arts Fund Cultural Tourism Accelerator. mirragma gunugurr-wa launch 31 July 2023, Bicentennial Park, The Esplanade, Darwin.

Nightcliff Village Public Art Expressions Of Interest

City of Darwin is calling for expressions of interest (EOI) from Darwin-based artists for an exciting public art opportunity in Nightcliff Village.

The successful artwork may be used in a variety of applications including but not limited to footpath designs, waste storage screens, drainage grates, lighting frames, deck risers, concrete seats and back rests.

EOI submissions will need to respond to the location and themes of place, community and the culture of Nightcliff Village.

This activity is part of the short-term initiatives identified and as a result of the Nightcliff Village Masterplan consultation process.

City of Darwin Lightbox Exhibitions Program next series curators

Expressions of interests closed in May for City of Darwin's Lightbox Exhibitions program, calling for local curators or lead artists to apply for the next two 6-monthly exhibition series taking place between September 2023 – September 2024. The submissions went to panel made up of City of Darwin staff and an ACDAC member.

The successful curators for the next two 6 – month series are Carla Russo from The Artful Room in Nightcliff and Amina McConvell from the Free Space Studio Collective in Coconut Grove.

The Artful Room will launch their series *Bird Story* in early September, and it will be exhibited within the lightboxes until the end of February 2024. All the works featured in *Bird Story* are by local Darwin based artists from a range of visual arts training and backgrounds, and include established, mid-career and emerging artists in the mix. This series will feature physical artworks that have been professionally photographed and digitised for the purposes of printing and installing in the lightboxes.

The Free Space Studio series will follow Bird Story and will be exhibited from March – August 2024.

The Lightbox Exhibitions Program offers an opportunity to showcase local works based on a shared and relevant theme and curated by a local creative. The program considers applications including traditional visual art forms, photography, graphic and digital artforms and printmaking. Visual artists of all ages, backgrounds, and stages in their career are encouraged to apply.

City of Darwin is committed to supporting local creatives and providing a professional and public platform to showcase original works.

The current series *Born to be Wild* was curated by Wild North Arts Inc and features 10 Darwin based graphic and comic artists. *Born to Be Wild* will remain on display until the end of August 2023.


Happy Place 2.0 (East Point Reserve Tables Artworks Project)

Gloria Richards' series Happy Place 2.0 will be extended to include 4 more artworks, which will be painted onto 4 aged concrete picnic table and seating infrastructure within East Point Reserve. Her works, concepts, and designs for this project draw inspiration from local built and human made every day constructs as well as elements and hues from the surrounding natural environment and biodiversity. Gloria infuses tones from the local ocean and bush landscape and embeds them into the design concepts, responding to where Larrakia land meets the Arafura Sea and the associated human activities and ways of being that take place in this location.

Celebrating the intrinsic connection between humanity and the natural world *Happy Place 2.0* - aims to provide more moments of delight around East Point. Each table will be a site-specific construct of intricate patterns and interlocking forms that evoke the essence and energy of Darwin's vibrant tropical life and draw from a bold and varied colour palette.

Colour is the space where the geometry of minimalism and the ornamental engage, and *Happy Place 2.0* will draw on each artworks distinct environment to inform and infuse the aged, utilitarian urban furniture with a burst of energy and playfulness. As site-specific geometric abstraction art installations, the tables aim to prompt contemplation, and foster an appreciation for the power of art in transforming and revitalising public areas. Happy Place 2.0 continues to ignite a sense of collective identity, unity, and joy, strengthening Darwin as a dynamic city that celebrates art, culture, and nature.

Gloria is a local visual artist and graphic designer. City of Darwin is committed to supporting and growing the local creative, arts and cultural communities for the benefit of all who live, work, visit and study here.

Sally Clifford, Lead Consultant from Matrix on Board, provided an update on the development of the Creative Strategy 2023 – 2030 and key findings from the now completed consultation period. 325 individuals were engaged in the process which included the online survey, public and stakeholder focus group sessions, workshops with City of Darwin staff and Elected Members and targeted phone interviews.

Next steps are for Matrix on Board to formulate a draft document based on the extensive consultation data for Arts and Cultural Development staff to review with consultants and the ACDAC Working Group before the end of June. The presentation included opportunity for the Committee to provide input, query and discussion and included the following notes:

A key feature moving forward is to celebrate and collaborate with Larrakia and Larrakia organisations. A range of aspects were discussed including some distinctive aspects of local knowledge and culture such as combination of salt water and freshwater perspectives, sense of place, vital histories and stories, the importance of local foods, and seasons unique to Larrakia along with arts and creative practises.

Multicultural voices and identities in Darwin was discussed as inclusion the draft strategy and how this will fit across the priorities and key goals.

The role and importance of partnerships between the City of Darwin, community and sector. What is already here, what is being done well, what can be built further upon.

Focus on the whole of the municipality in regards to arts, culture and creative practises. Discussion included measurement tools against implementation plan and how the future Creative Strategy will be reviewed within the seven year timeframe.
