PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to update the Advisory Committee on current Recreation projects and activity across City of Darwin

KEY ISSUES

- The redeveloped Casuarina Aquatic and Leisure Centre (CALC) is scheduled to open Dry Season 2024.
- Development of Accessibility Guides for City of Darwin pools is underway.
- In May 2024, the Coordinator of Recreation and Leisure attended the Parks and Leisure SA/NT Regional Conference, with the theme Places for Everybody Inclusivity in sport, recreation, and open space.
- Council commitment to masterplan for Malak Regional Play Space in 2024/25 Municipal Plan

DISCUSSION

City of Darwin Pools

The redeveloped Casuarina Aquatic and Leisure Centre (CALC) is scheduled to open soon. The facility features improved wheelchair accessibility including:

- three universal access toilet and shower facilities across the site
- Adult change facility
- Ramp access to 25m and 50m pool
- Zero depth entry leisure pool
- Sling hoist for 25m pool
- Aquatic wheelchair

AIAC members will be invited to the opening event.

The development of Accessibility Guides for City of Darwin pools is underway. Flare Access have completed site visits at Nightcliff and Parap pools and are now working on the guides for both facilities. Once CALC is open a guide will also be prepared for this site.

Parks and Leisure SA/NT Annual Conference

On 9 May 2024 City of Darwin's Coordinator of Recreation and Leisure attended the Parks and Leisure SA/NT Regional Conference, with the theme Places for Everybody - Inclusivity in sport, recreation, and open space.

The one-day event featured case studies of inclusive play spaces and recreation facilities, and inclusive programs. Highlights included:

Thorndon Park Playground

Designed with a range of accessible equipment integrated into the space and includes signage in AusLan, Braille and a communication board.

Wulanda Recreation Centre

Includes separate program pool that can be used for special needs groups. Lower ceiling, sensory-adaptable space that allows lighting and sound to be adjusted. Can close off pool for private facility if required by various cultural groups.

Sport4All Program – Alice Springs Town Council

Sport4All appoints an Inclusion Coach within Councils to work with sporting clubs and schools to assist people with a disability participate in sport, whether as a participant, coach, volunteer or official.

Active Inclusion SA

Active Inclusion is a disability and inclusion support body in South Australia, delivering best practice inclusion and diversity programs and advice to local government, peak body organisations, businesses, local sporting clubs and recreation groups.

Key Conference Learnings:

- Importance of communicating accessibility of a facility or space
- Developing a signage plan from the start of infrastructure projects

- Importance of pathways for intergenerational play
- Design considerations for sensory needs

Waters Ward Regional Play Space

The draft 2024/25 Municipal Plan lists a new Regional playground in the Waters Ward as a priority project to progress and provides funding commitment to Stage 1 that will see community engagement, design and documentation and site preparation take place.

Once completed this play space will incorporate accessible and multi-generational play, and as a Regional Play Space under the Play Space Strategy 2023-2030, it will include key elements such as:

- Unisex toilets
- Changing Places facility
- Shade structures
- Integrated pathways
- BBQ facilities
- Picnic tables and seating
- Signage
- Lighting
- Drinking taps

Best practice examples and learnings from across NT and interstate will be considered when developing the design.

Jingili Water Gardens Play Space

The adult change facility at Jingili Water Gardens has been assessed against the Changing Places specifications and City of Darwin is currently working through addressing the recommendations in the report to ensure the facility can be fully accredited.

A new children's crossing was recently constructed on Bauhinia Street, Nightcliff and another will soon be constructed on Mitchell Street, Larrakeyah.

Accessible Parking Bay on Cavenagh Street

City of Darwin has committed to widening the accessible car parking bay on Cavenagh Street adjacent the Roma Bar to make it more accessible for when the person with disability is the driver of the vehicle using the bay.

Bus Stop 129

- Bus stop 129 Karama Crescent, Karama is on the current bus stop upgrade program.
- Consultation was carried out in July 2023 and the department did not receive any feedback regarding the upgrade to the stop. The consultation notice is attachment 1.
- The new upgrade design is currently with the City of Darwin for approval, once approved the works to upgrade the stop should commence within three months.
- Currently this stop is attended to by the bus stop maintenance team once week.
- From July 2023 there has been 19 additional requests for maintenance for this stop.
