An update is provided to the Committee on current items associated with Darwin Military and Civilian History Advisory Committee.

East Point Military Heritage Interpretive Signage

City of Darwin has written to stakeholders concerning the military historic site at East Point where war relics are currently interpreted through a series of interpretive signs.

Unfortunately, the interpretive signs are no longer readable or enjoyable to look at due to their deterioration.

Due to their poor condition, City of Darwin is considering removing them and has sought feedback from stakeholders – Darwin Military Museum, Royal Australian Artillery Association NT, National Trust, Toursim NT, NT Heritage and the East Point Reserve Advisory Committee.

Stakeholders' views will provide an understanding regarding these signs to determine an appropriate course of action.

DISCUSSION

Lores Bonney Park

Lores Bonney Park, Parap (Lot 7206) is named after the Australian aviator. Recently City of Darwin received a request for a plaque to be placed in Lores Bonney Park (Parap) detailing Lores Bonney and her aviation history, the proponent was advised that City of Darwin would liaise with key stakeholders to see if they support the request and if so look to refer the suggestion to the Darwin Military and Civilian History Advisory Committee.

Stakeholders

NT Heritage

- that Lores Bonney Park is a not a declared heritage place and from a general heritage point of view cannot see any issues with this proposal.
- there are many people associated with aviation commemorated in Parap and given that the park is already named Lores Bonney Park it would be fitting to establish a plaque providing further details of her achievements.

The Historical Society of the NT

- it supports the proposal to install a plaque in honour of Lores Bonney.
- we understand that the park is already named Lores Bonney Park and a plaque commemorating her relevance to the Northern Territory would be very fitting. It would be an ideal way to provide information on her to those who visit the park.

City of Darwin officers attempted to contact the Fannie Bay History and Heritage Society; however the organisation has closed.

A suggested site at Lores Bonney Park would be the green concrete table and seating, with the plaque installed in the middle by a mason. The plaque would be cast bronze with etched wording, approximately 300mm x 200mm, and approximately 5 to 6 lines.
