The purpose of this report is to update the Committee on current items associated with Darwin Military and Civilian History Advisory Committee.

#### East Point Military Heritage Interpretive Signage

Eight interpretive signs at the war relics at East Point across from the Darwin Military Museum have now been replaced.

The eight signs replaced are:

- No. 1 9.2-inch gun emplacement
- Cordite magazine
- Engine room and tower base
- Underground searchlight engine room
- RH 6-inch gun emplacement
- Semi-underground magazine x 2
- Right Hand tower
- Armourer's hut

#### WWII Fish Trap - Interpretive Signage Nightcliff Foreshore

The Committee supported a proposal from the Northern Territory Heritage Branch for the installation of a small free-standing interpretative sign along the Nightcliff foreshore that interprets a WWII fish trap at its meeting on 1 May 2024.

The Committee's resolution was presented to Council for consideration on 28 May 2024 and the following resolution was made by Council:

- 1. THAT the report entitled Interpretive Sign Proposal WWII Fish Trap Nightcliff Foreshore be received and noted.
- 2. THAT Council approve the installation of an interpretive sign along the Nightcliff foreshore interpreting a WWII fish trap.
- 3. THAT Council note the responsibility and costs for the production and installation of the interpretive sign be the proponents.

The Northern Territory Heritage Branch has been advised of this resolution.

#### Cyclone Tracy 50th Anniversary Commemorations

Planning is underway for a program of activities, events and projects led by City of Darwin, the Cyclone Tracy Commemoration Advisory Committee and community groups.

The program aims to commemorate, raise awareness of and recognise the significant impact of Cyclone Tracy on the Darwin community, and assist with the ongoing healing process for survivors.
