PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to update members on relevant on-ground works, management, or matters relating to the East Point Biodiversity Management Plan.

KEY ISSUES

Updates since the last meeting are summarised below

DISCUSSION

- A commemorative event is planned for early morning on 25 December 2024 at East Point marking the 50th Anniversary of Cyclone Tracy. The event is being organised by Remembering Cyclone Tracy Inc, and plans to include the unveiling of their memorial located near the Beach Car Park.
- In accordance with City of Darwin's Cane Toad Management Plan for East Point Reserve, staff have continued to undertake regular cane toad management events on site. A total of 837 toads have been removed from the reserve, collected during six events held between February and October 2024. Over this period, toad numbers in the reserve reduced noticeably. As such, the most recent October event additionally targeted the breezeway area and found high numbers of toads. Ongoing events will continue to include this area.
- Resurfacing works along the monsoon forest walking track are now complete.
- The Terms of Reference updates agreed to by members at the meeting on 16 May 2024 were approved by Council on 13 August 2024. All committee members have signed the updated Terms of Reference.

FANNIE BAY EQUESTRIAN CLUB ITEMS FOR EAST POINT ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING

Thursday 14 November

TREES - THANK YOU

FBEC would like to thank the Council for:

- Planting and mulching some new trees along our front fence to replace ones that had died.
- Organising the removal of dangerous trees in our grounds: ones that were infested with Mastotermes darwiniensis termites and others that were already dead.

Request:

 Could the Council supply FBEC with more young native trees (termite resistant) and possibly mulch, for the club to do more tree planting during the wet season?

CANE TOAD MANAGEMENT

As part of our ongoing commitment to improving the cane toad situation at the club, the committee made the decisions to:

- 1) Not irrigate paddocks unless it becomes necessary. i.e. if we end up having a prolonged dry.
- 2) Only irrigate the front lawn area near the firepit.
- 3) Empty all water troughs not in use as soon as the horses are not in those paddocks.

Cane toad busts

May: 10 toads majority caught in water troughs + one cane toad looking very sick on the front lawn. This is when we started leaving water troughs empty.

June: 5 toads.

July: 2 toads squished on road + 3 found on cane toad hunt.

August: 2 located in water troughs.

October: 26 located in / near water troughs (more due to rains)

Total: 48 in 6 months – significantly fewer than usual due to changed water management practices

GOANNAS

Biodiversity Watch recently completed another round of focusing on the yellow Spotted Monitors, *Varanus panoptes*, a threatened species of reptile in Darwin. This was a 'mark and recapture' study, where they weigh, measure, photograph and number and/or microchip the animals which are caught before releasing them again.

Normally this research study is performed in May, however Graeme Sawyer was unavailable until September. This year Graeme was able to capture **five large goannas at FBEC** but **(only)** one goanna in the greater East Point Reserve area. Unfortunately, he later informed us that no goannas were found in their other catchment area at Charles Darwin University.

Graeme again emphasised that FBEC appears to be an 'oasis' for this threatened goanna. Well done to all our members for continuing to help control the cane toads and improve our pasture and trees.

He also said that we could expect to see young goannas soon. The following day the first one was spotted.

BIRDS

There are many different species of birds nesting at FBEC. Some like **curlews and plovers** are breeding well. Others are regular visitors: **magpie geese**, **barking owls and kingfishers**.

The **tower built** in one of FBEC's paddocks **to attract osprey**, is occasionally visited by these birds, but none have nested there.

When the tower was built several years ago, large sticks were wired onto the platform. Over the years **this 'nest' has deteriorated and there are loose and broken wires visible**. FBEC contacted the Council because of perceived danger to the osprey. Apparently creating a 'nest' for the birds is not appropriate (they will do it themselves) but in the meantime we still have sharp exposed wires.

Request: Could the Council have the 'nest' (remaining sticks and broken wires) removed?

WEED MANAGEMENT

FBEC has managed to **eliminate almost all Sida and Gamba Grass in the grounds**, but we have a new weed, **Tar Vine**, that we are currently battling following advice from professional agronomists.

Tar vine (*Boerhavia coccinea*) is found throughout Australia. It grows in a wide variety of habitats, and in tropical, subtropical, semi-arid and temperature regions. It depletes soil moisture and nutrients, reducing the yield potential of the subsequent crop. Tar vine also acts as a green bridge for crop pests and disease.

Tar vine has very small sticky seeds and each plant produces hundreds of seeds. Because the seeds are sticky, they can attach to horses, clothing and machines. This weed will grow vigorously at this time of year and the club is making great efforts to control it.

FBEC HORSE WASH BAY

FBEC has taken note of the recommendation in the updated East Point Biodiversity Management Plan regarding the need to upgrade the club's horse wash bay in the short term as a very high priority water management action.

Consequently, FBEC will shortly be submitting a grant application for a Minor Community Grant to help fund the construction of a new horse wash bay with proper drainage. This will allow the club to demolish the existing inferior horse wash bay, which the club will replace asap with a second new horse wash bay with proper drainage.

With 29 horses, the club requires 2 wash bays with proper drainage, that can accommodate 3 horses each, so that the drainage is adequate and no longer an issue.
