- City of Darwin provides a range of online maps to support access to local services and infrastructure
- The Accessible Map includes features to assist people with disability to navigate Darwin
- Accessibility filters allow users to search for accessible toilets, parking, pathways, and recreation facilities

DISCUSSION

Accessible Map:

City of Darwin has an online Accessible Map to help people with disability move around Darwin area more easily.

Key Features:

Shows accessible toilets, parking, pathways, and community facilities.

Can be filtered to suit individual mobility needs.

Helps people plan their trips with more confidence and independence.

Implementation:

The system is live on City of Darwin's website under "Access and Inclusion".

There is room for future additions or edits to be made or features to be added over time.

DISCUSSION

Sport4All

Sport4All is an inclusive sports program delivered through a new partnership between City of Darwin and Sport4All.

The program aims to increase opportunities for people with disability to participate in sport at both school and club levels.

Inclusion Coach

In partnership with Sport4All, City of Darwin has employed an Inclusion Coach.

Inclusion Coaches in this national program are either a person with disability or someone

with lived experience as a family member of a person with disability.

The Inclusion Coach works directly with local sports clubs and schools to:

Build participation in sport by people with disability

Promote inclusive coaching and program design

Support the employment and leadership of people with disability in sport

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9.3 DISABILITY PARKING PERMIT PROCESS

PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to provide an update for the committee on the Disability Parking Permit Process. This update and presentation will be delivered by the Regulatory Services team.

KEY ISSUES

- City of Darwin process applications for a Disability Parking Permits in the municipality.
- Disability parking permits facilitate daily activities for people with disability by providing access to convenient and safe parking.
- Disability Parking Permits are available to people with mobility limitations and those who require special parking consideration.

DISCUSSION

Disability Parking Permit Process

The Australian Disability Parking Permit is available to people with mobility limitations and those who require special parking consideration.

Application Considerations

- There is a first-time fee of \$21 when applying for a disability parking permit.
- Disability permits are valid for a three-year period.
- Renewals are free of charge for permanent permit holders only.

Documentation

Medical report to be completed by a medical practitioner.

Completion of the Application for an Australian Disability Parking Permit.

Requirements

The Australian Disability Parking Permit is for individual use only by registered users and must not be shared, loaned or given to others. The permit must be clearly displayed on the left-hand side of your dashboard, with both the expiry date and permit number visible from the outside of the vehicle. Permit is not to be displayed when the permit holder is not using the vehicle. When parking, you must also comply with specific concession entitlements and regulations that apply in the area where your vehicle is parked.
