#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this report is to inform Arts and Cultural Development Advisory Committee Members of the outcome of the recent City of Darwin elections and the membership of the 24th term of Council.

#### **KEY ISSUES**

- On 23 August 2025 City of Darwin elections were held for Lord Mayor and Elected Representatives across all wards
- On 6 September 2025 NT Electoral Commission announced the appointment of the new Lord Mayor and six new Elected Members with seven Elected Members returning for an additional term
- On 30 September at their first Ordinary Council Meeting Councillor Patrik Ralph was appointed as the nominated representative on this Advisory Committee for their term of Council, with Councillor Kim Farrar being appointed as the Alternate representative

#### **DISCUSSION**

On 23 August 2025 City of Darwin elections were held for 24<sup>th</sup> term of Council for the City of Darwin. The elections were for Lord Mayor and Elected Representatives across all wards. City of Darwin local government area is made up of a Lord Mayor and four wards with each ward having three elected representatives.

On 6 September 2025 NT Electoral Commission announced the appointment of the new Lord Mayor and six new Elected Members with seven Elected Members returning for an additional term.

The new Lord Mayor is Peter Styles.

Chan Ward is represented by two returning Elected Members - Councillor Peter Pangquee and Councillor Ed Smelt and a new Elected Member - Councillor Julie Fraser.

Lyons Ward is represented by two returning Elected Members - Councillor Sam Weston and Councillor Mick Palmer and a new Elected Member - Councillor Nicole Brown.


Richardson Ward is represented by one returning Elected Member - Councillor Jimmy Bouhoris and two new Elected Members - Councillor Shani Carson and Councillor Edwin Joseph.

Waters Ward is represented by two returning Elected Members - Councillor Sylvia Klonaris and Councillor Kim Farrar and one new Elected Member - Councillor Patrik Ralph.

On 30 September at their first Ordinary Council Meeting Councillor Patrik Ralph was appointed as the nominated representative on this Advisory Committee for their term of Council, with Councillor Kim Farrar being appointed as the Alternate representative.

For this Advisory Committee, it may be of interest to note that the 24<sup>th</sup> term of Council of City of Darwin has three First Nations people elected, including a previous community representative of this Committee and a returning Elected Member representative. This Council also boasts the youngest person elected to City of Darwin.



- Delivery of Darwin Street Art Festival Double Exposure Event and four street art projects across City of Darwin assets including Alawa Amenities, Nightcliff Community Centre, Street Furniture Nightcliff Foreshore and Casuarina Library.

City of Darwin is committed to supporting and growing the local creative, arts and cultural communities for the benefit of all who live, work and visit our city.


In line with Council's Creative Strategy 2024 – 2030, Arts and Cultural Development Officers have prioritised projects that fit under the three focus areas: Celebrating Larrakia, Distinctly Darwin and Invigorating Spaces.

# Celebrating Larrakia

Goals under Celebrating Larrakia include elevating Larrakia stories, culture and creativity through increased audience exposure, setting up new commissioning agreements and advocating for increased visibility of creatives. Three recent projects with Larrakia artists, including a new copyright agreement, have been undertaken.

#### **Amenity Block Artwork**

A project opportunity arose to deliver a vinyl wrap for an amenity block located along the Esplanade. Given its proximity to the sculpture *mirragma gunugurr-wa* by artists Roque Lee and Trent Bundirrik Lee, it was decided to extend the visual and cultural theme of this artwork across this site. A copyright agreement was formalised with artist Trent Bundirrik Lee for the use of his works *Walking the Path Together* and *Guidance of Ones' Past*. The artwork *Guidance of Ones' Past* was incorporated into the final design for the amenity block wrap.





Walking the Path Together

Project delivered in coordination with the Infrastructure team. Following its success, the team has requested two additional wraps for new amenity blocks scheduled for installation in early 2026 along the esplanade.

#### **Irrigation Tank**

Through a copyright agreement with artist Keelan Fejo, his work *Rarrkbun* features on an irrigation tank located at Wulagi Oval. Keelan Fejo is a Mayalli and Larrakia man, born in Darwin and raised in Katherine, NT. From an early age he watched his dad paint and quickly learnt the skill of steady hand crosshatching, a technique that remains central in his work today.

Keelan Fejo also plays Men's Premier League Football (AFL) for Wanderers Football Club, in the Northern Territory Football League. The Wulagi Oval is currently the Wanderers training ground for 2025!




#### **Street Sweeper**

The project wrapping Fabian McLennan's artwork 'Mix Dreamings of Larrakia & Tiwi Connections' on a new City of Darwin sweeper was completed in June. His work is now moving around the suburbs as a large-scale double print, featuring his original drawings with an inversion of white on black best for the daily vehicle usage. Fabian's artwork represents both sides of his family cultural heritage. Fabian is a Larrakia man through his father and Gurindji man through his mother. He inherited the name 'Pompa' by his late father and Larrakia Elder George McLennan, who as a member of the stolen generation grew up on Tiwi Islands. Through this and other recent projects undertaken, we aim to also meet achieve our Distinctly Darwin goal of elevating art by artists with disability and providing showcase opportunities.



This artwork represents Fabian's Larrakia and Tiwi connections, hunting for bush turkey on Larrakia country. The (animal) prints represent hunting for bush turkey and the crocodile connects to hunting on Larrakia Country, as Dangalaba (Crocodile) descendants. The Boomerang is used to hunt the Bush Turkey. The eggs represent the Bush turkey and Crocodile eggs, with the Shovel Spears honouring the Tiwi connection and used for Ceremonies and stories.

#### **Distinctly Darwin**

One of our priority areas is to support creative initiatives that promote and celebrate Darwin. This includes the delivery of an annual program for creative enhancement of street furniture or other assets across the municipality. To achieve this copyright agreements were established with local artists for City of Darwin to use original artworks across a range of projects.

#### Irrigation Tanks - Waters Ward

The Waters Ward saw the installation of a further four vinyl wraps on irrigation tanks at various locations in Wulagi and Anula. Of the four artists, three had submitted for the Smith Street project and, although not selected for that project, were recommended by the assessment panel for future opportunities. The artists' Ifa Shiddiq's *Around Town* is located off Thrush Court (Wulagi), Sarrita King and her work *Dancing* is located off Snipe Court (Anula), and Carla Russo's *Water Walkers* located off Clifton Court (Anula).

A further artist included in the mix was Tisha Tejaya, well known for her work on the *Parap & Rapid Creek Market Pocketbook*. The artist's work *Mangrove Tapestry* was installed off Jade Court (Anula) rounding out the project with diverse and colourful offerings.



Around Town by Ifa Shiddiq, was initially drawn for the Mindfulness Colouring Book project with LAUNCH Darwin and showcases the artists love for the city.

#### **Light Pole Wraps**

Through a copyright agreement with artist Tara Darcy, supported by Arts Access Darwin, her work *Maningrida Community* features on four new light pole wraps near the Nightcliff Jetty. This project was undertaken as part of a Nightcliff Foreshore lighting upgrade, coinciding with three new light poles installed in the jetty carpark. The Arts Team worked with Arts Access Darwin and Tara to select a range of her motifs representing her coastal home community Maningrida, including figures, bird life, barramundi, buildings, planes, boats and turtles. Tara has lived in Darwin long term and is a member of Arts Access Darwin's Free Space Studio collective. A program running for more than a decade, supporting local artists with disability, working to advocate for and provide creative opportunities. City of Darwin has worked with Arts Access Darwin on several projects since 2019 across the city.

Tara Darcy's work also features on new City of Darwin merchandise, such as water bottles and tote bags, including her work *Barramundi*.

These projects - focused on creatively enhancing City of Darwin assets - experienced a significant marked increase in engagement on the City of Darwin's Facebook platform. Across eight posts, the average number of acknowledgments was 218. Notably, the posts were further amplified through the artists' own networks, as they shared each other's content and engaged in conversations by commenting on one another's posts.

# **Lightbox Exhibitions**

In alignment with Creative Strategy 2024 – 2030 goals, the Arts and Cultural Team have developed and extended the Lightbox Exhibitions program to allow for further elevation of professional artists and their work. An additional three light boxes were installed at Casuarina Library bringing the total to 13. Other locations include Smith Street Mall, Dragonfly Carpark (Chinatown) and Nightcliff Pool.

Telstra NATSIAA Top End Artists is the latest exhibition to be installed in the lightboxes. 13 artworks have been selected by the curatorial team at the Museum and Art Gallery of the Northern Territory (MAGNT) for this exhibition. Telstra NATSIAA Top End Artists proudly features a range of Territory artists who are winners and finalists in the 2025 Telstra National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Art Awards (NATSIAA).

These artists offer a glimpse into the artistic, cultural and linguistic strength and richness of First Peoples. Hosted in Darwin on Larrakia Country, Telstra NATSIAA is the longest-running art awards that recognises the outstanding work of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

The selected artworks are made by artists who are continuing and maintaining their cultures, responding to current affairs and reflecting their unerring connections to Country. First Nations Territory artists are creating the very best of contemporary art, from the Southeast to the Top End, Darwin and beyond.

The acclaimed artists from the 2025 Telstra NATSIAA featured across the lightboxes are: Barbara Puruntatameri, Binygurr Wirrpanda, Charmaine Ashley, Dorothy Warrngarrknga Ganambarr, Lucy Yarawanga, Obed Namirrkki, Owen Yalandja, Pedro Wonaeamirri, Roger Yambeing, Sonia Gurrpulan Guyula, Wayilkpa Maymuru, Yalmakany Marawili, and Yinimala Gumana.

#### **Invigorating Spaces**

With a strategic goal to increase flexibility and accessibility for outdoor short term creative opportunities, City of Darwin called for expressions of interest to fund an accessibility audit for a major event or festival each year.

#### Improving Accessibility for Major Events or Festivals 2025/2026

This pilot project opened for submissions from 06 May and closed 03 June for commencement from July and expended by financial year end. Grants were available to amounts up to \$4,000.

The EOI attracted three applications and of these, two of which were successful.

The NT Irish Association (NTIA) received grant funding to enhance accessibility and inclusion at the 2025 NT Irish Music Festival, held at the Darwin Ski Club on 12 July 2025. The event attracted approximately 3,500 attendees who embrace Irish culture of dance and music. The grant enabled the introduction of a dedicated children's sensory-safe play area and chill-out zone. The space provided a calm, low-stimulation environment, supporting neurodivergent children and adults who might otherwise feel overwhelmed by crowds or noise.

Building on the success of their 2024 pilot, Darwin Festival partnered again with Regional Combined Therapies to deliver a dedicated low sensory space at the INPEX Sunset Stage during four children's performances. The low sensory area provided a supportive environment that was highly valued by families, particularly those with neurodivergent children or individuals with sensory sensitivities. The spaces essential in fostering inclusive participation at the family shows.

The initiative is being considered for delivery again in 2026 and will closely align with the recently published Access Strategy 2025 – 2030 strategic goal to increase accessibility of events delivered or supported by City of Darwin.

# **Smith Street Streetscape - Public Art**

The public artworks commissioned as part of the Smith Street Streetscape Project are progressing through the delivery stages.

Lee Harrop's Foundation Stone has been installed and completed. The artwork draws attention to the geological material used in its creation, Mt Bundy granite, exploited in the construction of Darwin City roads, footpaths, building facades, flooring and furnishings. Large blocks of granite are often used as the foundation plinth or base for a statue, memorial or plaque. In contrast, this artwork foregrounds the granite as the artwork, drawing attention to its inherent aesthetic qualities and making the often overlooked or invisible, visible. The artwork is both archive and symbolic memorial to Mt Bundy where this rock was sourced from a quarry that was otherwise destined for international export.

Katy Moir's and Amina McConvell's *Rest. Stop* is currently being installed. In this work the artists have fused the functionality of street furniture objects into a sculptural installation that serves as a three-dimensional backdrop for a mural painting that responds to the theme of 'interconnectedness'.

The artwork uses geometric shapes and patterns to create colourful passages and places of connection for pedestrians. These resting places are optical artworks that manipulate relationships between two-dimensional and three-dimensional shapes, interior/exterior relationships of forms, colour placement, and sightlines between objects.
