BACKGROUND

Sister City Advisory Committee resolved at the last meeting on 23 November 2022 to deliver the projects/programs proposed for inclusion in the Draft Sister City Advisory Committee Action Plan 2022-24, as listed in **attachment 1**.

A total of \$30,428 is committed to the programs recommended by the Committee and considered by City of Darwin in alignment with the Policy 053, International Relations and Sister City Policy. BACKGROUND

Darwin International Dragon Boat Festival is a two-day international event featuring sport, business and cultural exchange activities. These activities are designed to support, enhance and promote connections between Darwin and its Sister and Friendship Cities, and to showcase Darwin businesses and our diverse community.

Hosted by City of Darwin and funded by the <u>National Foundation for Australia-China Relations</u>, Australian Government, the Darwin International Dragon Boat Festival will include Dragon Boat Racing and the Darwin International Trade Show. Events will be held across Darwin, at the Waterfront, and other Central City locations.

On the first day of the festival (4th June), there will be Dragon Boat Racing demonstrations. Dragon Boat Racing is the ultimate high-spirited team sport that fosters a strong bond between members. Dragon Boat Racing has enjoyed healthy support in Darwin since it was first introduced in 1998. Along with viewing the races, there will be other activities catering to and showcasing our diverse and vibrant community here in Darwin. The Dragon Boat Race is a fun, festive race and is not intended to be conducted to international standards for dragon boat racing. The emphasis is not on competitive racing, but as a demonstration from experienced dragon boat teams, facilitating new cultural experiences. It is designed to showcase the sister/friendship cities relationships held with City of Darwin and facilitate cultural exchange between Darwin and its sister & friendship cities. It is a truly festival spirited day to celebrating our Chinese-Australian connections.

The Second festival day (5th June) will be focused on businesses and trades with the hybrid Darwin International Trade Show. The trade show day of the festival aims to provide an opportunity for businesses and organisations to promote their services and products to the Darwin community and worldwide.

That the Sister City Advisory Committee provides feedback on the draft Memorandum of Understanding for the establishment of a Friendship City relationship between the City of Darwin and the City of Kupang.

BACKGROUND

The Sister City Advisory Committee considered the proposal on 23 November 2022 and recommended Council accept the proposal to establish a Friendship City relationship with the City of Kupang. The below criteria were used to assess the Friendship City proposal:

- People to people relations
- Gross Domestic Product
- Economic Growth
- Trade activity
- Investment
- Research commercialisation
- Academic
- Innovation
- Tourism
- Business and industry affiliations

City of Darwin resolved on 7 February 2023 to establish a friendship city relationship with the City of Kupang, Indonesia.

City of Darwin is seeking feedback and comments on the draft Memorandum of Understanding from the Sister City Advisory Committee as well as the International Relations Advisory Committee on 10 March 2023 to be considered by Council.

Once the MOU is approved by the Council, City of Kupang will send out a formal letter to the Mayor of the City of Kupang to confirm and they will be invited to sign the Memorandum of Understanding on 5 June 2023 at the Darwin International Dragon Boat Festival and Trade Show 2023.

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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A FRIENDSHIP CITY RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE CITY OF DARWIN, NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA, AND THE CITY OF KUPANG, EAST NUSA TENGGARA PROVINCE, REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA

City of Darwin, Northern Territory of Australia, and the City of Kupang, East Nusa Tenggara Province, Republic of Indonesia, declare the desire to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to develop a friendly and cooperative relationship.

- 1. The purpose of this MOU is to acknowledge that both cities will contribute to deepening mutual understanding, exchanges, and cooperation.
- 2. Both cities agree to exchange information actively and cooperate around topics including, but not limited to, Tourism, Sports, Economics and Trade, Health, Education, and Social Culture.
- 3. Both cities shall not provide or disclose confidential information acquired through mutual exchanges to any third party without prior consultation.
- 4. Any provision in this MOU has no legal binding force except clause 3.

Through the signing of this MOU, we aim to achieve a growing appreciation of each other's culture and enhance the people-to-people connections. This agreement sets a strong foundation of mutual respect between both cities.

This MOU will be valid for four years. This MOU shall come into effect from the date of signing and cease upon expiration or shall continue if re-signed by both cities.

This MOU is duplicated in English and Indonesian, both versions being of equal validity.

Signed in Darwin on the fifth day of June 2023, we pledge our cooperation as friendship cities.

That the Sister City Advisory Committee recommends the City of Darwin leverage the remaining 2022/23 budget of a maximum of no more than \$5,000 to fund the primary school N. 5 in Dili.

BACKGROUND

On 11 November 2022, City of Darwin received a request from the Dili Municipality for City of Darwin to provide support for the primary school N. 5 Lebutun, Metinaro Dili in the form of some books and funding.

The Sister City Advisory Committee resolved to develop a donation campaign for the school suppliers on 23 November 2023. City of Darwin is currently working with the Consulate General of Timor Leste to deliver this donation campaign.

City of Darwin received an update with the latest information on the school's condition. It was reported that the school has no electricity or fencing and the classrooms are not encloased and often messed up by the animals. Help is needed, if possible, to fund them to purchase some safety facilities and that school equipment is urgently needed.

A recommendation for the use of the remaining budget from 2022/2023 to help the school is proposed for consideration.

Subject to recommendation and then City of Darwin approval, the donation check can be presented to Dili Municipality, when the "Mayor" of Dili Municipality is in Darwin for the Darwin International Dragon Boat Festival on 4 & 5 June 2023.

That the Sister City Advisory Committee recommends the City of Darwin to provide \$6,000 for the 2023/24 Kalymnos – Darwin Language Scholarship Program from the Sister City Advisory Committee budget.

THIS REPORT IS TO BE PRESENTED BY TONY MIAOUDIS.

BACKGROUND

The Sister City Advisory Committee resolved on 23 November 2022 to recommend City of Darwin provides a \$6,000 scholarship to develop the Darwin and Kalymnos scholarship program as part of the Sister City Advisory Committee Action Plan 2022-24.

The purpose of this program aims to celebrate the 41st anniversary between Darwin and Kalymnos by re-initiating the annual Kalymnos – Darwin Language Scholarship Program. This program will be delivered in partnership with Darwin High School and the Municipality of Kalymnos. This program will include the selection and award of the scholarship to 12 high school students from Darwin and Kalymnos studying Greek and English. \$500 for each student.

City of Darwin anticipate an ideal opportunity to include the awarding and celebration of the program in conjunction with the Darwin International Dragon Boat Festival. On Monday 5 June 2023, there is an opportunity to award and announce the program at the Business Networking Cocktail party with the anticipation of a government delegation from the Kalymnos Municipality to attend this event. However, City of Darwin won't be able to cover the full cost for this additional aspect to the event and co-contribution is requested for this purpose.

The Greek Consulate, Kalymnos Brotherhood, Kalymnos the Greek Orthodox Community for North Australia has been contacted for the co-contribution of this program like in the past, however, there is no confirmation on the co-contribution to this report date.

The first recommendation is for Sister City Advisory Committee to recommend City of Darwin provides \$3,000 from the Sister City Advisory Committee Action Plan 2022-24 budget. This would cover the drinks and live stream cost for a Business Networking Cocktail function on the evening of 5 June 2023, at the end of the International Trade Show Day and to celebrate the 41st Sister City relationship anniversary. The food and venue cost for the Business Network Cocktail night is to be covered by other budgeting from the City of Darwin. The participants of the Business Network

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Cocktail party will include Darwin's sister/friendship cities delegations, Trade Show participants, Kalymnos community key stakeholders along with other Government officials.

The second recommendation is to provide \$6,000 for the 2023/24 Kalymnos – Darwin Language Scholarship program within the Sister City Advisory Committee Action Plan 2022-24 budget.

BACKGROUND

Based on recommendations from the Sister City Advisory Committee members, the following projects are proposed to be included in the Sister City Advisory Committee Action Plan 2022-2024. The Action Plan 2022-2024 projects have been reviewed and aligned against the program objectives in Policy 053 International Relations and Sister City.

Following the last Sister City Advisory Committee meeting and prioritisation exercise conducted during last the meeting 23 November 2022, a number of projects were put forward to inform the The Action Plan 2022-2024. The nature of the projects happened to be short term as there was only 8 months lift of the first financial year (2022/23 FY) for the associated budget. These projects have been included in the Action Plan and programmed to be delivered in the remaining period of this financial year.

Due to the shortfall in projects put forward within budget for the second financial year the Action Plan is intending to cover, a second round of project nominations was required. The Sister City Advisory Committee were invited by email to consider and propose additional new projects for the next 2023/24 FY. The proposals were then to be put forward for inclusion in the Sister City Advisory Committee Action Plan 2022-24 and discussed at the meeting on 1 March 2023.

The proposals received include:

- Kalymnos Scholarships
- Darwin Sister Cities Photo Competition
- Sister City performances at Darwin Festival
- International Women's Day Walk 2023

- 2. Supports implementation of programs that reflect CoD's reputation as a leader in tropical design
- 3. Engagement in community connectivity
- 4. The Greening Darwin strategy and provides a cool space to be used for recreation purposes.
- 5. Milikapiti as a destination known for its Aboriginal culture and recreational space landmark, built and supported by City of Darwin
- 6. And facilitates relationships between CoD and Tiwi Islands Regional Council Milikapiti (TIRC Milikapiti) residents and so provides opportunities for community development

Description

With high levels of housing overcrowding in Milikapiti, a community space for youth and adults would be a meeting place which enables people to be out of the house, enjoy fresh air and interact with others. Currently, there is no welcoming place for hosting community events or visiting services, business meetings or safe play space for children close to Milikapiti township.

What is seen in the photos below is a disused space and rusty playground. There is a lot of potential here to plant trees and rebuild an open-style seating area for example: comfortable park benches and a shade structure which provides protection from rain and can withstand cyclonic winds. Also a playground for community use would add value to the project as an inclusive community space for all. Local Milikapiti residents add Tiwi cultural elements which would be a significant drawcard and attract community pride.

City of Darwin has the human resources to support this project. A member of the CoD Gardens for Wildlife and/or the Horticultural team could travel to Milikapiti to meet with local councillors and residents to discuss and advise on design and layout. Construction materials may be donated and used to build the structures using CoD expertise and resources. Plants from the CoD nursery can be donated to the space. Regarding seating area, the CoD Planning and Development team may be able to source materials or supply the labour to construct comfortable seating spaces designed to complement the green arbour of flowering trees and bushes. As a joint project, TIRC is invited to co-fund this project and match dollar for dollar with CoD to fund the shade and playground structures.

As a valued Sister City, it is hoped that CoD, TIRC Milikapiti ward councillors and local Milikapiti residents will embrace this project as an opportunity to share dialogue and create a space that residents would value, maintain and use. Below are some testimonials from local residents.

Initial support for a Community Space project:

Lynette De Santis is a local Tiwi woman, Councillor with Tiwi Islands Regional Council Milikapiti ward, clinic worker, community store board member and social club board member. She says "I fully support a collaborative approach to creating a safe community space to enhance the social and emotional wellbeing of Milikapiti residents".

Will Heathcote of Jilamara Arts and Craft shared support for the idea of a suitable community space, sharing "The kids need more positive things to do. Whenever the school closes for any reason, they head to the art centre and it's just chaotic – don't get me wrong, Jilamara actively encourages kids and culture but they need somewhere suitable to hang out and play."

Initial costs would be for travel to and from Milikapiti to view the space. A design brief would be created between a nominated member representing TIRC Milikapiti and City of Darwin horticultural and planning staff. Equipment could be sourced locally or shipped over to be built on site. CoD may consider donating the playground for children and some spaces for youth. Local residents could be employed to help with construction and planting of trees and bushes -perhaps also a veggie garden. I would expect that the project will cost between \$2000 to \$4000 including and /or adding a financial contribution from TIRC.

For timing and budget purposes, the works could be staged over two dry seasons:

- Stage 1a site visit and development of design brief and plan with local representatives and CoD staff
- Stage 1b initial planting and installation of park benches
- Stage 2a install playground with shade cloth
- Stage 2b community meeting shelter

When completed, a delegation from this Sister City committee and the Lord Mayor could travel to Milikapiti to formally open the new space. A plaque commemorating the joint enterprise would be a nice touch.
