Discussion

- The Darwin Cenotaph Renewal Project was recently completed by the Darwin RSL Sub Branch through funding from the Australian Government.
- The construction of the eternal flame and forecourt required the removal of the civilian memorial walls and family plaques at the entrance to the Cenotaph.
- These plaques are stored for safe keeping at the City of Darwin.

- Planning is now underway to return the plaques to the Darwin Cenotaph area.
- Detail on the position and design of where the plaques will be reinstated will be shared with the Committee.
- Member John Hart advised that he has notified Council of an error in the content of one of the interpretive signs at the Cenotaph, this is specifically in regard to the date of the attack on Pearl Harbour with the sign stating 8 December 1942 (Australian time).
- The Committee agreed given the significance of the reference that the panel should be corrected and replaced as soon as possible. The Committee also agreed that the reference to "Australian time" should be deleted and the internationally recognised date of 7 December 1941 for the attack on Pearl Harbour be displayed on the sign.
