6.1 ACDAC Terms of Reference (TOR) Changes

Jane commented that ACDAC now includes 11 members but the quorum in the TOR is currently set at five members.

The committee agrees to retain current TOR diversity quota priorities at two Aboriginal and/or

Torres Strait Islander (ATSI) and two Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) members to reflect two different diversities priorities for member representation. These priorities can be reviewed at a later date if/when priorities change.

6.2 Darwin Sector Development/Darwin Creative

To progress this initiative ACDAC needs a working budget to define the scope, current offerings, how opportunities could be presented/collated through promotional materials; and established meeting points identified. CoD to extend out to:

- Young artists
- ATSI artists
- CALD artists

Suggestion to host three meetings/info stall set ups in different geographies to trial success. Aim is to extend the reach of Council and locating artists not already familiar with upcoming opportunities within the industry.

MAPS and the Breakfast Club already exists as an industry event. However there is a gap to bring other practitioners in. NAIDOC week, DAAF, CDU Open Day, Harmony Day, Malak could be potential sites for the trial.
