BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Successfully obtaining grant funding is an important function for Council. Sourcing additional funding provides Council a mechanism for delivering key projects that are aligned to achieving our Evolving Darwin, Towards 2020 Strategic Plan. Without this additional source of revenue many of these initiatives could not be completed within Council's approved budget.

Where possible, specific efforts are made to partner with our neighbouring Councils, other Territory Government agencies or community groups when applying for grant funding.

Many of the projects selected for grant applications are as a result of a previous Council decision. Where it is a new project (not previously scoped by Council), Elected Members are made aware either through individual Council resolutions or specific Council reports presented to Council for endorsement prior to submitting the application. However, this process is not always practical due to the very short times provided for submitting these applications.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to respond to a request from the Department of Local Government to seek confirmation from the 21st Council to change the name from Darwin City Council to the City of Darwin. The Minister for Local Government can then formally gazette the change of name.

6.2 Promote our Darwin City

KEY ISSUES

- Following advice from CridlandsMB, Council wrote to the Minister for Local Government on 28 February 2012 to effect a name change to the City of Darwin and a change of name for the council area, pursuant to section 9 (1) of the Local Government Act (Attachment A).
- The Department of Local Government has contacted Council to:
 - seek approval for the Minister, under Section 9 (2) of the Local Government Act to (by gazette notice) exercise any of the powers conferred by subsection 9 (1), except the power to constitute or abolish a local government area.
 - Confirm that the newly elected Council has passed a resolution confirming the decision of 14 February.
- Council has registered the business name the City of Darwin and Council officers have progressively rolled out the new brand, with the exception of legal documentation.
- Once the name change has been gazetted, then the City of Darwin name and logo can be used on rate notices, infringement notices and other requests for payment, ensuring consistent branding across all Council materials.

In 2011, a project was undertaken to refresh the brand strategy for Darwin City Council. A series of consultative workshops, focus groups and quantitative research was undertaken with the business community, Elected Members, Darwin City Council staff and the general public.

The findings of the research fully supported the development of a brand strategy which:

- Realigned the Council's brand values to meet the expectations of the Darwin community
- Evolved the current Council logo to achieve stronger visual impact and a more contemporary look
- Refreshed the logo colours to better reflect a modern, tropical capital city
- Renamed the Council the 'City of Darwin'


