

Foreshore Alcohol Consumption Hours


Council is seeking your views on reducing the hours when alcohol can be consumed at four locations along Darwin's foreshore.

Where are these Areas?



These public places all have defined areas and times when people may consume alcohol. Detailed maps online darwin.nt.gov.au/fac

Weekends and public holidays	12 noon - 10.30pm	12 noon - 10.30pm

The aim of the changes is to create safer community spaces and improve community amenity. Council aims for a balance that maintains places where locals and visitors can enjoy activities including the responsible consumption of alcohol.

Want to find out more about the current regulations?

The regulations around drinking alcohol in public spaces in Darwin and across the NT have some complexities and are not always well understood.

For instance:

- Did you know drinking in public places in Darwin is generally not allowed within two kilometres of a licensed premise (whether or not it is operating) unless it is a Council area with Exemption Periods such as along some foreshore areas.
- Did you know consumption of alcohol within this '2km zone' requires a permit at any other time/ place other than those outlined in the above 'exemption periods'?
