The funding programs optimise the use of public funds through efficient and effective management and ensure strong alignment to City of Darwin's 2030 Strategic Plan and values.

In addition to the areas outlined in these guidelines City of Darwin also supports a process for unsolicited proposals. Unsolicited Proposals are part of the Procurement Framework and any submissions should made through our electronic platform available on the City of Darwin website.

ELIGIBILITY

Individuals cannot apply to any of the City of Darwin's Funding opportunities. For information regarding the George Brown Scholarships for individuals please visit <u>https://www.cdu.edu.au/scholarships/</u> scholarships-finder/george-brown-memorial-scholarship

Individuals may be Auspiced by an organisation in the Community Grants program or as lead researchers in the Environment and Climate Change research grants.

Groups applying must fit the following status:

- Incorporated legal entity including not for profit
- Commercial entity (Exception not Community Grants)
- Auspiced project or informal group (Grants only)

Applicants will need to provide details of the legal status of their organisation including an Australian Business Number (ABN).

Applicants are ineligible who:

- have not satisfactorily acquitted previous funding within the specified timelines or owe money to City of Darwin
- apply to multiple programs within the same financial year (one per financial year)
- propose projects of a political nature
- do not reflect the values of City of Darwin or that breach our access and inclusion policy or other relevant policies
- canvas or lobby staff or Elected Members outside the official application or Council processes

REQUIREMENTS

In return for financial or in kind investment by City of Darwin we seek:

- Delivery of a service (Operating Subsidies)
- Community building and inclusion outcomes (Community Grants)
- Increased positive profile and visibility (Sponsorship)
- Important data or information (Environment and Climate Change Research Grants)
- Mutually beneficial opportunities with other tiers of Government or agencies of Government (Cooperation arrangements)

Across all programs City of Darwin seeks recognition through acknowledgement, appropriate use of our logo for supported activity and, where suitable, invitations to events, launches or other activities. In some cases it may be negotiated for Lord Mayor or Elected Members to speak at events or for officers to negotiate naming rights for activities.

All applications for support and acquittals will take place via <u>Smarty Grants</u> across all programs. All activity supported by City of Darwin's Funding program must:

- Take place within the municipality of Darwin
- Where appropriate reference City of Darwin's Economic Development Strategy
- Be guided by City of Darwin's Community Inclusion Policy
- Be undertaken by Darwin businesses for the benefit of the Darwin community
- Be led by Darwin community members whether through organisations, consortia or businesses
- Acknowledge clearly the support of City of Darwin in advertising, promotions and marketing activity
- Strongly preference suppliers located in Darwin where ever possible
- Ensure no single use plastics in the delivery of activity <u>https://www.darwin.nt.gov.au/community/</u> programs/climate-change-and-environment/plastic-wise
- Minimise and actively reduce any negative environmental impact resulting from the activity
- Adhere to the published guidelines and intent of the program
- Maintain appropriate public liability cover at a minimum of \$20Million
- Meet the requirements of reporting and acquittal
- Be cost effective and competitive
- Be consistent with relevant City of Darwin policies

Unless explicitly outlined in the formal agreement all Funding arrangements are:

- For the period covered by the formal agreement only
- Contingent on the applicant delivering on all agreed requirements
- Able to be varied slightly within reason once approved if circumstances change

ASSESSMENT

Applications will be reviewed and assessed in competitive rounds or within appropriate timelines by City of Darwin's Funding Panel against the criteria and focus of each category. Full, partial, or no funding will be recommended. Decisions are carefully considered to maintain the integrity of the process.

Council will consider the recommendations made at the most appropriate Council meeting in line with appropriate budgets and strategic objectives.

Minimum amount: \$5 000 Maximum amount: \$50 000

City of Darwin welcomes applications via Smarty Grants from Darwin research organisations, academics, businesses and community groups for this program.

PRIORITIES:

- Rigor ous methodology
- Practical and implementable outcomes for City of Darwin
- Inno vative ideas and technology for research, trial and development
- Alignment with and understanding of City of Darwin's Climate Emergency Response Plan and • Greening Strategy
- Positive quantifiable outcomes for City of Darwin and the local environment

CRITERIA:

Applications for grants should address one or more of the following areas:

- Climate change mitigation and adaptation •
- Conservation and improvement of natural systems including biodiversity enrichment
- Information gathering, technology or trial processes to improve any of the 2 areas above

OTHER INFO:

Activities need to be completed within 12 months of the grant being awarded.

Potential applicants are strongly encouraged to discuss applications prior to submission with the responsible officer and to be aware that contracts will stipulate ownership of data to be held by or shared with City of Darwin.

Operating Subsidies

Minimum amount: \$30 000 Maximum amount: \$150 000

PRIORITIES:

- Delivery of a service that City of Darwin would otherwise not be able to supply and is of direct and clear benefit to the community of Darwin
- Organisations with the capacity to deliver a professional, competitive service with maximum benefit and relevance to Darwin community
- Employment of members of the Darwin community, applications which provide strong outcomes for local Aboriginal employment are strongly encouraged

CRITERIA:

Applications should strongly demonstrate:

- Specific nature of the benefit to the Darwin community
- Cost effectiveness of their service delivery
- Sound budgeting and strong existing partnerships •
- The number of community members that will benefit from their service provision each year
- Clear, measurable data collection •
- Established history and capacity to deliver
- Sustainability beyond the funding period
- Leverage of other funding or income
- The number of free or low cost, subsidised hours/events/items to the community of Darwin provided through the period
- Equivalent Full Time Employment of Darwin community members (including volunteers if applicable)

OTHER INFO:

- 3 year applications will be favored
- Previous agreements in this category do not in any way guarantee future success. Applicants are advised this is a competitive process

Cooperation Arrangements

Cooperation arrangements are by invitation only.

This category of funding was developed in 2020 by City of Darwin and will be trialed for the first time with NT Major Events Corporation (NTMEC). The intent of Cooperation arrangements is to streamline processes with regular users of City of Darwin's assets such as parks and public spaces in regards to high levels of in kind support in exchange for alignment with program outcomes across Departments of City of Darwin.

In the proposed 2021 trial NT Major Events Corporation and City of Darwin agree to cooperate for mutual benefit in the delivery of Bass in the Grass. City of Darwin will provide in kind support through the use of public space, NTMEC will provide opportunities for training in event management and media for 10 young people in City of Darwin's Launch program.

Further Information

From time to time successful applicants may need to vary their projects, activity or delivery due to unforeseen circumstances. City of Darwin will work with successful applicants to ensure that reasonable variations are possible to meet agreed outcomes.

City of Darwin receive more applications across all programs than can be supported. Applicants are strongly encouraged to pursue multiple investment opportunities for their projects. Below are useful links.
