1. Community Grant Program Objectives

The Community Grant Program is an opportunity for Council to support organisations carrying out projects, activities or events of benefit to residents or visitors of Darwin municipality. The program aims to enhance the wellbeing and capacity of all people in the Darwin community; however **priority** is placed on applications that align with City of Darwin Strategic and key Plans.

Strategic and key plans include:



2. Funding Available

The maximum amount of funding you can apply for is \$10,000. The total amount of monies disbursed is \$50,000.

Your application may also be discussed with other areas of Council that have potential to offer support to your project

If your grant application is unsuccessful you may be eligible to receive In-Kind assistance from City of Darwin.

Seeking funds from other grant programs or the likes elsewhere will not affect the success of your application to Council, and may even provide more evidence of project viability.

In some instances successful applicants may not receive the full amount of funding, but rather a percentage of the total sought. If your project cannot proceed without full funding, this should be indicated in your application.

3. Eligibility

Eligibility to receive a grant is based on the following:

- Organisations must be incorporated not-for-profit. If the organisation is not incorporated the must seek another incorporated organisation to act as an auspice.
- Proposed projects or events must occur within the financial year in which it is funded.
- Activities must occur within the municipality of Darwin.
- Applicants who have previously received a Community Grant and haven't yet submitted the final financial report, or have debts to the City of Darwin should discuss this with the Community Inclusion Coordinator prior to applying.
- The application must be submitted through the Smarty Grants portal, which is available through www.darwin.nt.gov.au/grants





4. Ineligible Applications

The Community Grants Program doesn't fund:

- Applications for individual pursuits.
- General operating costs or ongoing core business. For example funding for permanent staff members, insurance and utilities.
- Projects that are considered the core responsibility of other levels of Government,
- e.g Department of Education or the Northern Territory Department of Health.
- Commercial events.
- School based projects that do not involve the wider community
- Event or conference sponsorship, prizes or award ceremonies
- Projects that have previously been funded through the Community Grants Program.
- Capital funds or improvements on private property.

5. Assessment Criteria

Applications will be assessed using the following criteria:

- Feasibility of the project and its potential to meet the objectives of the program.
- If other projects are already providing the same opportunities
- The targeted community is one that usually has fewer chances to participate in community life.
- How the project or event will acknowledge City of Darwin
- How well the organisation has developed the project's purpose and methods of reaching and working with the identified beneficiaries.
- How the project provides new opportunities for people to improve their lived experience of health and well being
- If the organisation is working in partnership with other organisations
- Programs that are innovative and sustainable and could lead to greater opportunities in the future
- How specific the budget is in the application.
- How well the project aligns with City of Darwin Strategic Plans





6. Application, Assessment and Acquittal

Round Opens

- Applicants submit application through Smarty Grants, including audited financial statement and certificate of incorporation
- Community workshops are held while the round is open to assist applicants

Close of Round

- Assessment Panel read and score all applications against criteria (see page 5)
- Assessment Panel meet to determine recommendations for funding
- Recommendations are submitted to elected members on the City Life Committee
- Final funding allocation decisions are made at an Ordinary Council meeting

Grants funded

- Successful and unsuccessful applicants are notified
- Successful applicants raise an invoice and sign a service agreement
- Successful applicants are invited to attend a Grants presentation award ceremony hosted by Lord Mayor

Project delivery

- Grant project is delivered. City of Darwin is actively involved through projects
- Photos provided to City of Darwin for promotional use
- Social media engagement continues
- Acknowledgement of support from City of Darwin is included in promotional material

Acquittal

- Financial Acquittal and Project evaluation to be submitted within 3 months of the project's completion
- Project evaluation includes successes, challenges and photos of work completed
- City of Darwin utislises evaluations and acquittals to learn from successes and challenges

7. Funding requirements

Successful applicants will be required to sign a Grant Agreement with City of Darwin that details the commitments between the community group and Council. Successful applicants will require written Council approval to change the Grant Agreement, such as changes to major items purchased or the timelines of the project.



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8. Acknowledgement of Assistance

Successful applicants will be required to acknowledge the support provided through the grant. This can be through the use of City of Darwin's logo on promotional materials as media advertisements, press releases, signage at events and / or other methods. A digital copy of the logo will be supplied. The organisation is encouraged to invite Council's Elected Members and the Lord Mayor to events, launches and other activities.
