What is the Playground Consultation?

Council is going to upgrade seven playgrounds across Darwin as part of our Playground Program. These playgrounds have equipment that is old and worn and is in need of an upgrade. The playgrounds also need shade structures which will be installed at the same time.

Six of the playgrounds are *Neighbourhood level*. (See overleaf for more information on the different playgrounds.) Examples of the selection of equipment are on our website. Upgrading all the playgrounds together will ensure Council gets value when buying a range of equipment.

When are the New Playgrounds Being Built?

The new playground equipment and shade structures are scheduled to be installed in September - December 2017. Residents in each area will be informed 1-2 weeks prior to works commencing. Our website will have the latest information. darwin.nt.gov.au/playground-upgrades

Can Council put more equipment in my local Playground?

Not all playgrounds in Darwin can be big. Darwin's playgrounds are divided into three levels: Regional, District and Neighbourhood.

There is a spread of these playgrounds across Darwin. Most residents have a local *neighbourhood playground* nearby, a *district playground* that's often a short drive and then the four *regional playgrounds* that are *destination playgrounds*. Council budgets are allocated according to the level of playground.

- **Regional Playgrounds** include Bicentennial Park Play Space, Yanyula Park, Lake Alexander and Jingili Watergardens. These are big playgrounds with lots of equipment. Families from all over Darwin travel to these playgrounds.
- **District Playgrounds** such as Moil Oval, Jingili Oval and Tiwi Oval are medium sized playgrounds and have a variety of equipment. They are generally used by locals and families from a broader area. (Mindil Beach playground is district level.)
- **Neighbourhood Playgrounds** are smaller playgrounds that are often used by locals who live within walking or cycling distance.
